May 8<sup>th</sup> 1915

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, held at its office on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1915. Present Geosschrook  
W. S. Wilson and W. C. Jewett.

Mr. W. S. Wilson offered the following preamble and resolution, and moved the adoption of the same, which was duly seconded by Mr. Geosschrook

WHEREAS, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 1913, a petition was filed with the board of county commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, signed by the owners of at least a majority of the foot frontage abutting on a county road described as follows:

*Commencing at the intersection of the Hess + Mc Guffey Pike with the township line road; thence north to the Northingon and Granville Pike a distance of about 2 miles, situated in Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio*

praying for the grading, draining, macadamizing, ~~curbing and paving~~ of the said road under the provisions of sections 6903 to 6914, inclusive, of the General Code of Ohio; and

WHEREAS, The board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, has, by resolution duly adopted, found and declared that the public utility and convenience require that said road described in said petition be improved by grading, draining, macadamizing, ~~curbing and paving~~ the same; and

WHEREAS, Section 6905 of the General Code of Ohio, provides that "The Board of County Commissioners may enter into an agreement with the board of trustees of any township or the council of any village, or both, into or through which a state or county road improvement is contemplated, whereby said board of trustees or council may assume and pay such a proportion of the cost and expense of such improvement not assessed upon abutting land in accordance with section 6904 of the General Code, as may be agreed upon between said board of county commissioners and said board of trustees or council, and such agreement or agreements may be entered into at any time before the contract for said improvement is let"; therefore

(OVER)

BE IT RESOLVED, By the board of trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, that it believes that the public utility and convenience require that said road be improved by grading, draining, macadamizing, ~~curbing and paving~~ the same, as provided in sections 6903 to 6914, inclusive, of the General Code of Ohio; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we, the trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, do agree for ourselves and our successors in office, to pay from the township funds of Sharon Township Eighteen per cent (15%) of the entire cost and expense of the surveys, supervision and construction of all that part of said road improvement, located in Sharon Township as provided in section 6905 of the General Code; that said payment of 15 per cent of the entire cost thereof shall be fully paid to the treasurer of Franklin County, Ohio, before the expiration of 10 years from the first day of June, 1915; that interest at the rate of 5% per annum will be paid upon all deferred payments made after the date of bonds issued and sold for the purpose of providing funds for the said road improvement until date of payment by Sharon Township; all conditioned on the construction and completion of said road improvement, as provided for in specifications prepared by the county surveyor of Franklin County, Ohio, and approved by the county commissioners.

It appearing to the Trustees that notices had been issued according to law, they proceeded to view said line of controversy.

After viewing said line the Trustees ordered the following:

To E. F. Fassig is assigned the portion of said fence beginning at the south-east corner of said E. F. Fassig's farm and running thence on the line between his land and that of S.S. & Belle Williams north about 49 rods to a square post said portion to be by him constructed and kept in repair.

To S.S. & Belle is assigned that portion of the fence beginning at said square post in the line between said lands about 49 rods from the S. E. Corner of E. F. Fassig farm: thence north to the north-east corner of E. F. Fassig's land: thence west to the east line of the Worthington and Galena road, <sup>a total of about 49 rods</sup> the same to be kept in repair and maintained by them.
