Received letter from Charles C. Higgins making complaint about the fence between his property and that of Smith Bros, and requesting the Trustees to view the same.

Clerk notified him that the trustees would meet Friday June 23, 1911 to view fence between property of Lewis Fink and Smith Bros, and that if he could be present some equitable adjustment could be arrived at so that it would not be necessary to call a second meeting.

He notified the Clerk that he could not be present but would put the matter in the hands of R.W. Marcell his caretaker who could represent him.

Minutes of Special Meeting, held June 23<sup>rd</sup> 1911.

Board met in called session on the premises of Lewis Fink and Smith Bros, for the purpose of establishing the fence between said parties. All members were present, also Lewis Fink, Milton Smith and J. A. Simons, who rents the Smith farm.

The Trustees measured the fence, beginning at the corner of the school ground in Dist No 3 running thence east 3216 feet to the <sup>North</sup> east corner of Lewis Fink's land, the same being also the north west corner of Charles C. Higgins land.

Assignment was then made as follows:

To Lewis Fink was given that portion of the fence commencing at the North-east corner of his land, being the east end of the line between him and Smith Bros, thence west 1608 feet to a cherry tree which was marked as the center of said line, his portion being the east one-half of fence. To Smith Bros was assigned that portion of the fence commencing at said Cherry tree in the center of the line thence west 1608 feet to the ~~west~~ south-east corner of the school land in Dist No 3, their portion being the west one-half of the fence.

In the case of the fence between Smith Bros and Charles C. Higgins, Mr Smith agreed with Mr Marvell representing Higgins that the Trustees could view and assign the line between them. In order to give the Trustees legal authority the following waiver was drawn up and signed by both parties.

"To the Trustees of Sharon Tp. Franklin Co. O. Gentlemen:-

We hereby waive the Ten Days notice in the matter of viewing the fence between the said Smith property and that of C. C. Higgins, and consent to your establishing the same at once"

The Trustees then proceeded to measure the line between the two properties and found that beginning with the Northwest corner of Chas C Higgins land it measured 1933 feet to the west line of the C. C. C & St L. R.R.

The following assignment was then made: To Chas C Higgins was given that portion of the fence commencing with the west line of the C. C. C & St L. R.R. thence west 966½ feet to a large beech tree on the line, which was established as the center of the line.

To Smith Bros was assigned that portion commencing with the said beech tree thence west 966½ feet to the northwest corner of said Charles C. Higgins land.

Clerk was instructed to notify the interested parties of the assignment and that they were given 60 days to put the same in good condition.
