"In the Matter of the Application of D. W. Pastlewate to assign a partition fence. It appearing to the Justices that Emma Calhoon having had due notice of the order of assignment heretofore herein made of the partition fence between her and the said D. W. Pastlewate by the Justices of Sharnon Township on application of D. W. Pastlewate, and that she has failed to comply with said order of assignment and that application has been filed herein by D. W. Pastlewate the aggrieved party, to have the same sold as provided by law.

It is therefore ordered that the contract for building the said portion of said partition fence heretofore herein assigned to Emma Calhoon and furnishing the labor and materials therefor be sold to the lowest <sup>responsible</sup> bidder.

That said fence be according to specifications as follows:-

Item 1 - Clearing fence row of old rails and brush and piling same in neat piles upon Mrs Calhoon's property as nearly adjacent to the fence as possible and with least possible detriment to any growing crops that may be on said premises.

Item 2 - Material - 68 line posts: 2 corner posts: 4 Braces 4x4-8 ft in length or 4-8' line posts: #9 smooth galvanized wire for braces: Necessary amount of fence

staples:  $66\frac{1}{2}$  rods of #9-10-47 fencing, about 100 lbs heavy barbed wire.

Item #3 - Necessary tools and labor in setting posts and erecting fence. End and line posts may be either locust or cedar of good quality, bidder to specify which in submitting bids. End posts to be not less than 7 inches in diameter at small end and at least 8 feet in length.

End posts to be placed not less than  $3\frac{1}{2}$  feet in ground, and line posts at least  $2\frac{1}{2}$  feet in ground. Line posts to be 7 feet in length. Women wire fence to be a field fence of 10 lateral wires, 47 in. in height with stay wires 16 to the rod. All lateral and stay wires to be of #9 galvanized wire, and generally known as No 9-10-47 fence.

Line posts shall be set  $16\frac{1}{2}$  feet apart in line following present and established boundary as nearly as possible. End posts to be firmly set anchored and braced. Fence to be tightly stretched in first class workmanlike manner. One strand of heavy barbed wire to be stretched 4 inches above women wire fence.

In transporting material to site of fence all due precautions must be observed not to damage or destroy any cultivated crops upon the premises of either Mr Calhoun or Mr Pastlewait.


