Gentlemen:-

We have your letter before us requesting an opinion as to the action of the Board of Trustees in a line fence controversy. By your letter it appears that on complaint of the aggrieved person for the refusal of the adjoining land owner to build his portion of a line fence, the trustees went upon the land and viewed said line fence and found the conditions therein to be that one-half of a line fence was up and that both the adjoining owners lay claim to the fact that they had build this portion.

After careful consideration of these facts and an examination of the statutes and law relating to the duties of the township trustees as to the building of a line fence, we are satisfied that under the above circumstances wherein both parties are laying claim to the portion of the line fence already built, the trustees are not in a position to assign to the land owners or land owner, the portion of the fence to be built, as their duty relating to the assignment of such fence is purely defined by statute and is not judicial in its character. That is, the trustees are not to receive evidence from the parties in controversy and determine who the responsible party is. Should the trustees proceed to assign the portion of the fence not built to either of the parties, and they refuse to pay the same, suit would be necessary upon the assessment placed against said land owner's property by reason of his failure to pay, and said land owner would be entitled to a defense of mistake on the part of the trustees in assigning the portion of said line fence to him, and assessing the cost of the same against him. And should the land owner be successful in establishing such defense, the trustees would be placed in a rather embarrassing position because of the mistake on their part in assigning this fence and awarding the contract thereto. The question under those circumstances might necessarily arise as to whom should the person building the fence look for his money.


We are of the opinion in the present situation wherein the trustees cannot conclusively and accurately determine which land owner has built his portion of said fence, the safe policy for the trustees to follow would be to refuse to assign the line fence. The aggrieved party, therefore, should he insist on the trustees taking action, would be placed to the necessity of mandamus the trustees, to carry out their duty under the line fence statutes, in which proceeding the trustees could set out the state of facts on which they refused to assign the fence and let the question as to the ownership be determined by the court.

However, if the parties in controversy can come to some conclusion as to who built the portion of the line fence which now exists, then the action of the trustees in the premises would be plain, and it would be their duty to proceed according to law in awarding the contract.

Minutes of Jan. 1, 1924, show that the trustees by resolution transferred \$10.00 from the road fund to the drag fund. This transfer was made not made on the clerk's ledger and the clerk informs your examiner that there is little or no need for a drag fund to be created for the reason that practically all the roads of the township are improved roads.

The clerk's minutes are neatly and comprehensively written up. The clerk certifies the sufficiency of funds under Section 5660 G.C. and records same in connection with the allowance of claims by the township trustees.

While no violations were discovered during the period of this examination the attention of all township officials is called to the provisions of Sections 12910 and 12911 G.C. which make it a criminal offense for any township official to sell property, supplies or fire-insurance to the township and to Section 12912 G.C. which provides a severe penalty upon any township trustee who is interested in any contract, job, work or service rendered, aside from official services, to the township, or within one year thereafter retiring from the office of township trustee.

Attention is called to Section 17-1 G.C. which fixes a limit of eight hours on any calendar day for labor, except in cases of extraordinary emergency and that Section 17-2 G.C. provides a severe penalty for any violation.

As a matter of information to the township trustees, should they deem it necessary or desirable to purchase road machinery or equipment they must first secure the consent of the county commissioners as required by Section 7201 G.C. This consent as to purchase and terms should be in writing so that same can be entered in the minutes of the trustees.
