8. The trustees do not certify the ledgers on the last Monday in December each year, as required by Section 3315 G.C.
9. Drag Fund.

Section 3375 G.C. reads in part as follows:

"At the beginning of each fiscal half year the township trustees, before making any other appropriation from the road fund in the treasury, shall appropriate and set aside out of said fund a sum sufficient to meet the expense of dragging the graveled and unimproved roads of the township during the ensuing six months. Such sum shall not be used for any other purpose than that for which it was appropriated."

The trustees continue the practice of paying the bills for dragging the graveled and unimproved roads of the township to the road fund.

10. Bills.

The bills for road material and supplies are approved by the trustees and the county surveyor, according to law, but only a few of the other bills are approved before payment. All bills for material, supplies and service, including those paid from the poor fund, should be approved before payment so that responsibility for their correctness may be established.
