Lots cannot be purchased by township residents for non-residents for a reduced fee. Fee of \$400.00 must apply. No more spaces than the number of persons in a family are to be sold to anyone unless approved by the Board of Township Trustees. (Family being husband, wife, and children living at home.) Used space must be paid for at the time of burial.

No funerals are to be scheduled on Saturday afternoon or Sunday without the approval of the Superintendent. No non-resident indigent burials are to be accepted.

No monument, stone or marker is to be removed from any grave space unless written permission has been granted from the Sharon Township Trustees. Clerk must have written notice on file from the lot owner and/or relatives requesting the removal of same.

No funeral flowers are to be removed from the grave site unless permission has been granted by a member of the family in the presence of the Superintendent. Artificial flowers are banned. Fraternal and other emblems will be permitted for thirty (30) days following a burial and then will be removed.

No deed will be issued until the lot is paid for in full.

Accounts are to be paid in full within 90 days. No interest is charged. A fee of \$10 to \$25 is retained as a service charge on lots repurchased by Sharon Township Trustees. Fee governed by Board.

Chief Hale submitted a letter of resignation from Reserve Officer Tom Clouse effective 1-9-1985. His full time job will be requiring more of his time and some travel making it difficult for him to serve on the department.

A letter was received on 1-7-85 from John W. Leibold, attorney representing Ronald A. Herman, 181 Rosslyn Ave. regarding Resolution 11-7-84 #1. Mr. Herman is challenging the validity, legality and constitutionality of the resolution. On 1-9-85, Chief Hale wrote a letter to Craig Paynter of the County Prosecutors Office requesting advise on how to handle this matter. No reply has been received.

Chief Hale discussed with the Trustees an accident involving Officer Larry Chapman on 1-4-85 in which cruiser #485 sustained approximately \$400 in damage. Minutes of the February 6, 1985 meeting were read and approved.

Mr. John Drake was present to receive a "Saved By The Belt" award for his son, Randall Drake, who was involved in an auto accident on November 11, 1984. This award is presented by the Ohio Department of Highway Safety to persons who survive serious traffic crashes while wearing seat belts. The presentation was made by Chief Hale and Mr. Bachelor. Randall Drake has moved out of state and was unable to receive the award personally.

The Flint Cemetery Warranty Deed, dated May 26, 1874, was removed from the safety deposit box at the bank to determine the road right of ways. A copy was made and the original returned to the bank.

The Trustees viewed an Application for Deposit of Public Moneys and signed an Agreement for Deposit of Public Funds with The Ohio State Bank covering the period of 2-1-85 to 2-1-87.

A letter was received on 2-11-85 from Ken Carey, Lauterbach & Eilber, Inc. reporting that The Home Insurance Company is withdrawing from the Public Officials Liability market. Coverage will continue with the National Casualty Company. There will probably be an increase in the premium and/or deductible.

The Clerk reported that the Franklin County Township Trustees and Clerks Monthly Meeting scheduled for 2-14-85 was postponed because of bad weather. It has been rescheduled for 2-21-85 at the Jackson Township Fire Department.

Information has been received regarding a Severe Weather Seminar to be held 3-11-85, 7:00 at Battelle Auditorium. It is sponsored by the Nation Weather Service and Central Ohio Radio Club.

The Disaster Services Agency Year-End Report 1984 has been received. It contains information on the activities of the agency and was placed on file.

Consumer Price Indexes for 12-1984 have been received. Increase from the previous month was 0.1%.

A letter was received on 2-20-85 from Joseph Brainard complimenting the Road Department for the fine way they have kept the roads in his neighborhood, Rosslyn, Kanawha, and Westview. Letter placed on file.

The 1980 Plymouth Gran Fury cruiser was sold at the 2-6-85 meeting by auction. Insurance coverage was cancelled with Call Insurance Agency on 2-7-85.

Chief Hale reported that he has received a report from Officer Larry Chapman's doctor stating that he is unable to do the routine police duties at this time and needs more time off. After discussion, the Trustees instructed Chief Hale to notify Officer Chapman in writing that they would like him to have a complete physical by the township physician, Robert Thompson, M.D. as soon as possible.

An opinion has been received from the Prosecutor's office regarding Resolution 11-7-84 #1 (see minutes of 11-7-84 and 1-16-85). The legal opinion is that the Township Trustees cannot fix a load limit. This can only be done by the Franklin County Engineers. Therefore, the 3 Ton Load Limit signs on Rosslyn, Kanawha, Westview and Milton will be removed. The Trustees will request the Franklin County Engineers for load limit or excessive weight signs to prevent damage to these roads. Prosecutors letter dated 2-8-85 was placed on file.

Parking on Rosslyn and Kanawha was discussed. The Fire Chief stated that it is a hazard to not be able to get through these streets when cars are parked away from the curbs because of the snow. Procedures will be started to prohibit parking on the north side of each of these streets.

Estimates had been received from Bob Keim Ford and Dick Ruhl Ford to repair cruiser #485 (see minutes of 2-6-85). Chief Wilson would like for the three lieutenants and Training Coordinator to attend. Mr. Insley so moved, seconded by Mr. Butterfield. All voted "Aye". Chief Wilson will submit the application to the Clerk for registration.





The Clerk reminded the Trustees of the monthly meeting of the Franklin County Township Trustees & Clerks to be held April 18 at 7:30, Perry Township. The next meeting will be May 9, 7:30 at Sharon Township. Sponsor is Bank One and the program will be by the Franklin County Sheriffs Office.

Mr. Chandler reported that he is still having problems with his telephone system. Mr. Butterfield will call Lou Sizer, 846-1554, regarding this.

Mr. Larry Olsen was present to talk to the Trustees about repairs to Westview. This street is in pretty bad condition as a result of the winter weather. The Fire Chief stated that about five new hydrants need to be installed. Also a new waterline is to be installed from Westview to Fenway on Riverside. After this work is done, a 3 inch blacktop surface will be put down. For the time being, the Road Dept. will patch the street and get it in good temporary repair.

The Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission 16th Annual Meeting Luncheon will be April 18, 12 noon, at the Hyatt Regency Columbus.

Notice was received April 8 from Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission regarding File #8104-85, property on the west side of Flint Road and south of Park Road. The proposal is to split about 0.7 acres, existing driveway to vacant portion of tract. Information placed on file.

A survey from the Ohio Bureau of Employment Services has been completed and returned. Requested was the number of employees of the township through March 12, 1985. There are 20 part-time and 40 full-time employees.

The Trustees requested Road Supt. Harold Chandler to submit a list of projects and priorities for the summer with Westview being first.

Mr. Dwight McCabe, 8250 Mulberry, was present to talk to the Trustees about vacating an unimproved road or alley (Sycamore) in the Mt. Air area. The road is east of Olentangy River Rd., south of Plumtree, north of Edgecliff. Mr. Insley will call the Prosecuting Attorney's office to find out the procedure to vacate said road.

Chief Hale reported a problem concerning Reserve Police Officer Dan Davis. Mr. Davis was sworn in on 4-4-84. On 4-10-84, a letter was written to the Ohio Peace Officers Training Council asking what update training was needed for Officer Davis to re-certify. A list of classes was received on 5-7-84. Officer Davis was given one year to meet the requirements. Because he has failed to do so, the Trustees will notify him by certified mail that his commission is being revoked and he is to turn in all township equipment as soon as possible.

Chief Hale submitted a copy of a letter he wrote to Chief Wilson commending the excellent job they performed in trying to save the life of Officer Jon G. Cave on 4-4-1985. Firefighters Elzey, Dunkel, and VanHoose were thanked. Officer Cave was buried on 4-8-1985. A letter of appreciation was sent to each police department which took part in the service.

Reserve Sgt. Mark Allen reported to the Trustees that the department is now down to four officers, himself, Chris Yingst, Ed Burton, and Bill Hane. He stated that he has two recent applications and is doing the background checking at present. He will be setting up interview times with the Trustees soon.

Lt. Ridgeway reported concerning an armed robbery at Telhio Credit Union on March 12, 1985. Two suspects have been arrested.

Chief Hale talked about the continuing problem he has had with the present repeater which has never been strong enough to cover the needed area. He submitted the following prices for a new repeater:

Because there is inadequate communication between the police cruisers and the base station, a solution must be found as soon as possible. Therefore, Mr. Butterfield moved to adopt an emergency resolution to authorize purchase of a General Electric repeater at \$8,175.00, seconded by Mr. Insely. All voted "Aye". The repeater will be ordered immediately and will take 8 to 10 weeks. It was decided to go with GE as that is what the Fire Dept. has and also the Road Crew and this will keep the entire communication system with the same equipment.

The Municipal Court fines have been received for the month of March totaling \$1989.50, receipt #316.

Fire Chief Ray Wilson submitted a request for Military Leave of Absence from Firefighter Paul Grutsch who has joined the U. S. Coast Guard for four years. Mr. Butterfield moved to grant the leave, seconded by Mr. Insely. All voted "Aye".

Chief Wilson stated that he needs to purchase a circular saw for Engine 102. He will submit two quotes soon.

Chief Wilson submitted the following five applications for Volunteer Firefighter:

All applicants have completed the minimum certification. Gladman and Dershem have passed our adgility test. Scott has passed Perry Township's test. Mr. Insley moved to hire all five applicants, seconded by Mr. Butterfield. All voted "Aye". It was reported that the township presently has seven female employees.

Chief Wilson explained a need to purchase a precision hydraulic valve and controls for the ladder truck. This would be placed on the bucket basket and costs approximately \$27,000 plus an intercom system for approximately \$2,000. Chief Wilson invited the Trustees to come to the Fire House to view the basket and further understand the problem.

Chief Wilson submitted a copy of a letter from The Ohio Municipal League regarding Federal Fair Labor Standards Act. This is an issue that will need to be addressed by the township in the very near future. The letter states that if a firefighter works more that 53 hours per week, overtime must be paid. Our men presently work 56 hours per week. This would require an estimated cost \$47,000 per year. An alternative would be to hire an additional three firefighters at an estimated cost of \$90,000 per year. The Trustees will be doing further study regarding this Federal Fair Labor Standards Act as it involves several areas of change.

A Mutual Aid Contract has been drawn up with the B.S.T.&G. Fire District in Delaware County. The Trustees signed the contract and it will be forwarded to B.S.T.&G. for signatures.

The Sharon Township Trustees, Franklin County Engineers, and Worthwood Development Corp. discussed the Pocono Road problem. The Trustees and Worthwood Development Corp. met on October 17, 1984 to discuss use of Pocono Road. The Trustees stated at that time that this road could not handle heavy equipment for this development. The Trustees were told by Worthwood Development Corp., John Christopher that no heavy equipment would be using this road as they had authorization to use an access road from the development to the south of the project. Mr. Christopher stated that he wanted to make the entrance to this development wider than Pocono Road and would widen same and Pocono Road (865LF as shown on Plat) and replace any damage to said road. The Trustees then agreed. Mr. Christopher of Worthwood Development Corp. had to submit plans to the Franklin County Engineers for approval. The Engineers stated that he would have to write a letter stating what his intentions were before they would approve of said plans to use this road for anything. A letter was written to the Franklin County Engineers on 10-30-84 and the Sharon Township Trustees have a copy of same. Heavy equipment has used this road. The road is nearly impassable. Residents of the area are complaining about the condition of the road. Mr. Christopher has informed the residents that Worthwood Development Corp. would be replacing the road soon. Now the problem is that Worthwood Development Corp. doesn't think that they should have to replace the 6" base. Worthwood Development Corp. wants the Sharon Township Trustees to put in the base of 6" of gravel 304. The Franklin County Engineers stated that this road was a substandard road as of 1961 with gravel and surface treatment but was adequate for residential use. School buses do not use this road, garbage trucks only once a week, and is adequate for fire equipment. Seldom does anything heavier use this road. The Sharon Township Trustees do not feel that they should have to go to any expense for fixing this road as it was used improperly by the Worthwood Development Corporation. The Trustees requested the Sharon Township Police Dept. and the Road Dept. to keep checking the area. The Trustees asked Mr. Chandler to give them an estimate of the yearly amount spent on Pocono Road for maintenance. The Trustees, Engineers, and Worthwood Development Corporation will meet next week to further discuss this problem.

Minutes of the April 17, 1985 meeting were read and approved.

The Financial Report as of May 1, 1985 was submitted and viewed.

Blue Cross and Blue Shield endorsements have been received and forwarded to each enrolled employee to be attached to their certificate.

The Walnut Grove Cemetery Trustees, Sharon Township Trustees, and Worthington City Council met on 5-13-85 for the purpose of levying tax for the maintenance of Walnut Grove Cemetery for the Tax Year 1986, a tax of .1 mill.

The Trustees talked to Mr. Chandler about his priority list of road work, Westview being first, Pocono next, and Old Woods third.

The resurfacing of Westview and the water line on Riverside were discussed. Five Smith hydrants need to be replaced on Westview. Fire Chief Wilson reported that water pressure on Westview and Riverside hydrants is about 20 gallons per minute. Normal is 1,000 gallons per minute. An alternate method in the interim is to relay water by truck from Kanawha and Riverside. Trucks can carry between 300 and 750 gallons of water. A new water line is not scheduled until September or October. In a 5-2-85 letter, the Franklin County Engineer reported that a 2 inch overlay on Westview would total \$49,738 and a 3 inch overlay would total \$58,777. Specifications for Westview have been requested from the Engineers.

Mr. Chandler reported that Pocono Rd. normal maintenance has been estimated at \$3,500 for a seven year period.

The Trustees requested Mr. Chandler to also estimate the cost of Old Woods Road by using Homeacre repairs of 1984 or Sharon Hills 1983 repair figures.

Mr. Chandler reported that Joel Kennedy, a college student, will be working the summer months starting 6-15-85. David VanHoose is working part time now in the cemetery and will help with road work this summer.

A Weed Notice has been sent to Janice L. Kline, Elmira, N.Y. regarding Ohio Revised Code Section 5579.05. In the past several years, Ms. Kline has paid the township for mowing the weeds on Parcel #6085, 1886 W. Granville Rd. which is \$35.00 per hour for two men and a tractor. Fire Chief Ray Wilson reported that the 1975 Engine 102 is spitting oil. Great Lakes, W. W. Williams states that the 12 cylinder walls are glazed and needs new sleeves and rear main seal. The truck is ten years old and has 38,000 to 40,000 miles on it. It drops transmission because of too much torque and driveline problems. Four wheel disc brakes were applied several years ago. It was depowered at one time. The possibility of putting a smaller engine in has been discussed, a V-12 to Diesel 6. The truck has 12 to 15 more years of service left with maintenance and available parts. Down time for repairs would be about two weeks. The rescue equipment could be removed and placed on another piece of equipment during this time. Cost to replace the engine would be about \$35,000. Repairing the present motor would cost about \$8,000 but \$32,000 has already been spent on the truck because of the torque. Chief Wilson will get some other estimates and report back.

Cost of Living increase for the quarter ending 4-1-85 is 1.1%. The raise will be given to all eligible employees.

Chief Wilson and Mrs. Bierly attended a meeting on 5-13-85 regarding the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act. They reported to the Trustees at this meeting.

The Mutual Aid Contract with the B.S.T.&G. Fire District has been signed by them and a copy returned for our files.

WHEREAS, the Sharon Township Trustees have undertaken a careful and comprehensive study to determine the actions necessary to bring the personnel policies and procedures of Sharon Township into compliance with the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act; therefore,

The Sharon Township Trustees do hereby adopt the following resolutions:

1. Exempt from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act are the following Township personnel: Police Chief, Fire Chief, Service Department Supervisor, Fire Captain, Fire Prevention Officer and Police Lieutenant.

2. The exact hours of work for all employees will be recorded on a daily basis and the Clerk of the Township will maintain these records for a period of at least three years.

3. The following work periods shall be established:

a. For all non-safety employees not exempted from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, 40 hours per week or a seven-day period.

b. For all police department personnel not exempted from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, the equivalent of 171 hours in a 28-day period.

c. For all Fire Department personnel not exempted from the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, the equivalent of 212 hours in a 28-day period.

4. All employees of the Township will be paid on Thursday, August 1, 1985, and be-weekly thereafter. If a payday falls on a holiday, the payday will be the following Friday.

5. The process of granting compensatory time off in lieu of overtime pay shall be discontinued.
6. Non-exempt employees shall not work during non-work time unless specifically assigned to do so by their supervisor.
7. All full-time, non-exempt firefighting and affected dispatcher personnel shall not respond to "tone alarms" or any other off-duty functions unless specifically directed to do so by their supervisor.
8. All non-exempt employees will be paid at the rate of 1.5 times their hourly rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of those hours specified in the established work period.
9. All non-exempt employees shall be paid overtime for hours actually worked in excess of the allowable limits from April 15, 1985, to August 1, 1985.
10. For employees eligible to receive longevity pay, payment will be made after the employee's anniversary date when the employee does not work in excess of the allowable limits during the work period.
11. Non-exempt employees attending required out-of-town training sessions shall be compensated, not only for time spent in sessions, but also for the time spent traveling to the sessions.
12. All Fire Department volunteers will be compensated according to the following schedule, effective August 1, 1985:
 - a. Recruit \$3.35 per hour
 - b. Firefighter 1 \$3.85 per hour
 - c. Firefighter 2 \$4.35 per hour
 - d. Firefighter 3 \$4.85 per hour
13. "Volunteer" police officers will be paid \$5 an hour for all hours worked.
14. The department heads of the Township shall post "Minimum Wage" notices on their respective bulletin boards or other conspicuous places in their work areas.
