The following were present: Trustees, Larry France, Paul Insley, Carl Knost; Clerk, Eleanor Bierly; Road Supt. Harold Chandler; Police Chief, Robert Hale; Fire Chief, Ray Wilson; Guests, Rick Becker, Dan Sutphen, B. Blankenship.

Minutes of the 12-8-80 and 12-17-80 meetings were read and approved.

The Clerk asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board for 1981. Carl Knost moved, seconded by Paul Insley, that Larry France serve as Chairman. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Carl Knost moved, seconded by Larry France, that Paul Insley serve as Vice-Chairman. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Sharon Township Trustees set the first and third Wednesday evening of each month at 7:30 P.M. to sign checks and talk with the Clerk. They will meet with the public at 8:00. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. France moved, seconded by Carl Knost, that Mr. Insley be appointed to serve on the Walnut Grove Union Cemetery Association Board for 1981. All voted "Aye" thereon. Other members of this board are John Wilbur, Jr. from Worthington City Council and James Charlton, member at large.

Chairman Larry E. France is automatically the member to the Franklin County Board of Health.

Larry France reported that the Trustees advertised in the Worthington News on 11-13, 11-20, and 11-27-1980 for Property Casualty Liability Package. Bid openings were 12-3-1981. It was awarded to Henderson Ins. Agency as of 12-22-1980. The Clerk is to have Eicher-Keys Agency cancel the following policies:

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France that the mileage rate of 20¢ per mile be set. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Trustees discussed method of collecting salary. Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that the Trustees adopt a method of compensation consisting of an annual salary to be paid in equal monthly payments. All voted "Aye" thereon. Per diem books are to be made and marked by the Clerk. (200 days @ \$22.00/\$4,400.00 yr.)

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Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France, that the Clerks compensation be set at the \$6,250.00 per year as determined by law. All voted "Aye" thereon.


BE IT RESOLVED, by the Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Worthington, Ohio has set the following rates for Flint Cemetery:

Lots cannot be purchased by Township residents for non-residents for a reduced fee. Fee of \$375.00 must apply. No more spaces than the number of persons in a family are to be sold to any one unless approved by the Board (family being husband, wife, and children at home). Used space must be paid for at the time of burial.

Foundation prices are to correspond with Walnut Grove Cemetery prices. Non-resident indigent burials are not to be accepted. No wooden boxes. Steel, concrete, fiber glass or plastic will be accepted.

Chief Hale requested to register Sgt. Ridgeway in the Perry Township basic S.W.A.T. course. This is an 80 hour course held from 2-7-81 through 3-28-81 and the fee is \$65.00. Paul Insley moved, seconded by Carl Knost, to enroll Sgt. Ridgeway. It was approved for Reserve Officer Mark Allen to also attend at his own expense. All voted "Aye" thereon.

David Pickney, President of Worthington Hills Exxon, submitted a gasoline cost to the Trustees. Cost is \$1.15.9 per gallon of unleaded or a spread of 4.3 cents per gallon over his cost. A 4 cent rebate would be received at billing.

The Clerk presented an invitation to the Inauguration Ceremony of John Circle, newly elected Franklin County Engineer, on 1-2-1981.

A letter was received by the Clerk on 12-22-80 from the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation stating that the auditor found the records in good order for the years 1977 and 1978.

The Clerk submitted a request from Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission to rezone .915 acres on the west side of Olentangy River Rd. 100 feet north of Linworth Rd. The request is to change from rural zoning to suburban office and institutional zoning for an office building, received 12-23-80. On 12-30-80, notice was received from MORPC of a hearing set for 1-9-81, 1:30 P.M. concerning this same area. Letters are on file.

The Franklin County Commissioners have requested the MORPC to recommend an appropriate zoning classification for the 3.159 acre Worthington Hills wastewater treatment plant site which has been abandoned, (12-30-1980). The Clerk received a letter on 1-2-1981 from the MORPC concerning this issue. The site will be considered on 1-9-81, 1:30 P.M. in a meeting of the Franklin County Planning Area Subcommittee. Letters are on file.

The Clerk presented a memo from Public Employees Retirement System, 1-2-1981, concerning "Final Average Salary Calculations" and "Social Security Offset".

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On 1-5-1981, notice was received concerning Amended Substitute House Bill #835, Ohio Revised Code, effective date 12-28-80. The mandatory period for providing wage and separation information has been changed from 10 calendar days to 6 working days.

A copy of the published notice of an Annexation Petition for annexation to the City of Columbus was received 1-6-81. The area involved is approximately .84 acres in Perry Twp. and 1.58 acres in Sharon Twp.

The Clerk discussed with the Trustees the "Ohio Privacy Act Administrative Rules for Local Agencies" which were received on 4-24-1979 and are still in effect. Rules are on file.

The Clerk reported that the Public Employees Retirement System Contribution Rates for 1981 are as follows: Employer contribution rate for police officers is 18.10% and 13.95% for all other members. The Member Deduction rate remains unchanged at 8.5% of gross compensation.

In a letter dated 12-16-80, Blue Cross/Blue Shield states the monthly renewal rates for the period 2-1-81 to 2-1-82 are as follows:

The Clerk reported on the following investments. A Huntington National Bank Certificate of Deposit in the amount of \$186,000.00 12.85%, 66 days expires on 1-8-81. \$86,000.00 will be deposited. \$100,000.00 will be re-invested at 16.5% for 57 days, 1-8-81 to 3-6-81.

An Ohio State Bank investment of \$50,000 purchased 11-28-80 at 10% for 50 days, expires 1-9-81. It will be re-invested until 2-9-81. On 12-15-80, \$64,000 was invested at 11½%, 62 days, expires 2-16-81.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France, that the vapor lights at Highview at Route #315 and at Clubview and Route #315 be paid for 1981. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Chairman of the Trustees presided over the meeting. The Disciplinary Hearing Charges were read.

Attorney William C. Moul spoke for Firefighters Robert K. Lewis and Robert E. Dunkel. He submitted their letters of explanation and apology. Mr. Moul stated that both Firefighters realized that their protest was unwise and had gone about it in the wrong way. Neither realized the seriousness of their actions and meant no affront to either Trustees, the Fire Chief, or fellow Firefighters. Both took the River Rescue Program, completed said course and were instructed that if they didn't pass the test that the test would be given again. Both asked the question, if they passed the test, would they be "Certified RRP"? Both were willing to retake said test. The attorney stressed that both men were trained personnel of this department for 15 and 7 years respectively, knowledgeable in the Fire Dept. disciplinary procedures, and requested consideration regarding their discipline.

Mr. Lewis spoke about his action and stated that he realized that he did not follow the proper procedure and used poor judgment in what he said and did. He stated that he was petrified of the water, had stated so prior to the course, but took said course and learned a lot. He is not as petrified of the water now but is still scared of River Rescue work.

Mr. Dunkel stated much the same and is afraid of the water.

The Chairman reported that the test scores had been reviewed and stated that Firefighter Lewis had passed the test. His grade had been 68 and was raised to a score of 72. A score of 70 was a passing grade.

Fire Chief Ray Wilson spoke about the undermining of authority, negative attitudes, and general lack of discipline.

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Fire Chief Wilson submitted three documents for the record.



The Road Supt., Harold Chandler, reported on general road work and drainage.

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Mr. & Mrs. Roberts appeared before the Trustees and spoke about the gasoline tank and general appearance of the area around the Sharon Township maintenance garage. (See 5-20-1981 minutes) They also made some accusations concerning a Township employee.

Fire Capt. Dan Overstreet submitted the June Vacation Schedule for the Fire Department. Schedule is on file.

The delivery date for the 1981 Horton Squad is June 15, 1981.

The Record of Proceedings has been received from the Industrial Commission of Ohio concerning a claim filed by Dan Overstreet, Claim #PE 959958, #PE 667617. Findings are on file.

On June 1, 1981, Certification of Employer's Rate for 1981 was received from the Police and Firemen's Disability and Pension Fund. The Firemen Employer's Contribution rate is 22.39% of earnings.

Painting at the Fire House was discussed. F.F. Donald Atkins submitted a bid for \$950.00 for labor only at the May 6 meeting. He has submitted an additional bid for \$725.00 for paint and supplies. The Pledge of Allegiance was repeated.

Minutes of the June 3, 1981 meeting were read and approved.

The Clerk reported that a \$100,000.00 CD at Huntington Nation Bank matured and was renewed for 30 days at 17.50%. It will mature on July 8, 1981.

Mr. Phelan of Mid-Ohio Regional Planning reported that Sharon Township has \$4,000 left from the fourth year entitlement and \$15,000 for the seventh year for a total of \$19,000. The Trustees want to use the money for the Rosslyn & Kanawha curb project.

The drainage problem in the alley between Rosslyn & Kanawha was discussed. It needs new tile, a catch basin, grading, or about 450 feet of heavy stone 8 to 10 inches deep. Mr. Chandler is to get estimates on the cost of stone and labor, etc.

A letter will be sent to the Franklin County Engineers informing them that Ohio Bell Telephone Co. has interfered with the natural swale in front of the property at 7977 Flint Road. They will be requested to investigate the problem.

Mr. Chandler reported that the Franklin County Engineers have repaired the damage done to Highview.

The Trustees instructed Mr. Chandler to hire additional help.

Fire Chief, Ray Wilson, submitted a letter of resignation from Firefighter Richard Landis, June 8, 1981. He was hired in October, 1980 and will resign effective June 22, 1981. Mr. Landis will be working for Westerville Fire Dept. The Clerk will write a letter to Westerville informing them that Mr. Landis has accumulated 102.9 sickleave with Sharon Township. He was given credit for 168 hours sickleave from Marysville Fire Dept. for a total of 270.9 hours. Mr. Ernest VanHoose was present to be interviewed by the Trustees as Chief Wilson has recommended him to replace Richard Landis. Mr. VanHoose was one of the top 16 on the eligibility list. He was a volunteer for Marysville in 1971, was full time in March, 1973. He has EMS and Para Medic training. He has 168 hours sickleave which can be transferred from Marysville. Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Knost, to hire Mr. VanHoose at \$15,568.92 salary. He will start as soon as possible. All voted "Aye" thereon.

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Chief Wilson stated that a change in Units has been requested. Firefighter Randy Molter, now on Unit 2 (Gary Wing) wants to transfer to Unit 3 (A. Hittepole). Both officers agree with the transfer as does Chief Wilson.

Chief Wilson reported that Dispatcher Judy Eastman is due for a seven year merit increase. Paul Insley so moved, seconded by Larry France. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Horton Squad is to be delivered on 6-19-1981 and \$27,219.41 will be due at that time. A check will be written.

Chief Wilson submitted a price list for equipment on the reserve squad for a total of \$2695.00. Larry France moved to purchase the equipment, seconded by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon. P.O.#8

Mr. David Roggencamp was recommended to be hired as a reserve firefighter. All voted "Aye".

Overtime and/or Out of Class has been worked by Jan Bloomer, Dan Overstreet, and Marvin Sells. The Trustees approved paying the men the additional amount earned.

The Fire Chiefs International Conference will be held in September in St. Louis, Missouri.

Fire Capt. Dan Overstreet reported that the Fire Dept. will have Open House on October 11, 1981, as a part of the Fire Prevention Week observance.



A break-down of the police hours, vacations, holidays, sick-leave, schooling, and meetings was presented. Chief Hale requested permission to hire another Reserve Officer. Permission was granted.

Mark Allen was hired as a Reserve Officer on 6-20-1980. In September, 1980 he was increased to \$5.63. After discussion, Paul Insley moved, seconded by Carl Knost, to return Mark Allen to \$4.00 per hour so that he will be paid the same as the other Reserve Officers. All voted "Aye" thereon. 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Mr. Arthur Bradley has requested to ^{have} Oak Drive closed, see minutes of 8-19-1981 meeting. It was again discussed but nothing has been done.

Fire Chief, Ray Wilson, submitted the resignation of Fire-fighter Jon Cave which was effective 9-16-1981. Placed on file.

A replacement for Jon Cave was discussed. Chief Wilson is to check the Eligibility List for three candidates. Chief Wilson plans to give Craig Hall the Firefighters Entrance Examination.

Chief Wilson submitted the 1980 Fire Department Summary Report. Included are statistics on personnel, equipment, fire runs, loss, and operations; EMS runs and operations; fire prevention operations. Report on file.

A Membership Contract with the Credit Bureau of Columbus, Inc. has been signed. The membership code number assigned to Sharon Township is 78358. Letter and contract are on file.

Chief Wilson reported that Medic Squad 102 needs repaired and repainted at a cost of approximately \$300.00. Carl Knost moved to have the repairs made, seconded by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Repairs on Engine 101 were discussed. Mr. France requested a 3rd bid. Pierce Mfg. has stated that their bid would be \$23,000.00 but would not put it in writing. Mr. Insley will schedule a meeting with Sutphen regarding cost of repairs on Engine 101.

The Ladder Truck was discussed. A fire department in California would like to buy it and gave an estimate of \$260,000 to \$280,000. Chief Wilson will get an estimate to replace same with a tractor drawn, aerial apparatus.

Chief Wilson submitted his travel expenses for the International Fire Chief's Conference for 1981 in St. Louis, Missouri from 9-12 through 9-17.

Chief Wilson reported that while in St. Louis, he saw and learned about Rockwell Dura Master air disc brakes. He requested that these brakes be placed on our new fire engine being made at Sutphen. Paul Insley so moved, seconded by Carl Knost. All voted "Aye" thereon. The Clerk will write to Sutphen Corporation requesting the change in brakes at an additional cost of \$1500 as stated in the Sutphen letter of 9-17-1981.

Chief Wilson stated that the same brake can be installed in other trucks for \$1800 per truck plus installation. He will check on the labor cost for same and report back.

Chief Wilson reported on his 10-5-81 meeting with Joanne Davidson regarding the Fire Levy and Fire Pension payment.

A tape recorder for the Fire Department has been discussed off and on for the past 14 months. The Chief discussed several types ranging from \$9408 to \$14,500. Minutes of the October 7, 1981 meeting were read and approved.

Financial Report 10-1-81-A was submitted.

The Clerk submitted the Revenue Sharing 7-80/7-81 Report. Report is on file.

The Revenue Sharing Expenditure Report for 1977 - 1982 was presented. Report on file.

Notice was received on 10-16-81 from Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission of a forum to be held on 10-21-81 at 7:30P.M. regarding the Franklin County Housing and Community Development Program.

Road Supt. Harold Chandler reported that Mr. Feathers, Mt. Air area, has requested the township to dig a trench under Buckeye Drive. He will furnish the tile.

As instructed at the 10-7-1981 meeting, Mr. Chandler is to check to see if the weeds have been cut just south of the Mr. Air swimming pool. If not, he is to cut them and give a bill to the Clerk, \$35 per hour for one man, truck, and tractor. The owner, Mr. Beougher, will then be billed.

Mr. Chandler reported that Edgecliff has been repaired with 46 D and Hot Mix.

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Sharon Hills, Highview, and Old Woods Road have all been repaired.

The Trustees asked Mr. Chandler to check on the property of Mr. Coontz, 6733 Maple Canyon to see if it has been cleaned up. See 10-7-1981 minutes.

Mr. Chandler reported on the Rosslyn and Kanawha alley repair.

In the 9-16-1981 meeting, Mr. Chandler requested uniform service for himself, E. Hesson, J. Fields, T. Kayati, and B. Chandler. He received bids from Atlas, Interstate Uniform Service, and VanDyne-Crotty Company. Cost would be approximately \$35 per week for all five employees. Paul Insley moved, seconded by Carl Knost to start the service. All voted "Aye". The Trustees will check with the Walnut Grove Cemetery Trustees to see if they will share the expense.

The Clerk was instructed by the Trustees to re-bill G. A. & Frances Snyder, R. Snyder, and J. L. King, \$175.00 for cutting weeds on W. Dublin Granville Road. They are to be told that if they do not pay the bill by 11-1-1981, the amount due will be added to their property taxes.

The purchase of a leaf machine was discussed but no decision was made.

A letter was written 10-13-1981 to Franklin County Engineers requesting to be added to the Winter Salt Program. It was estimated that the Township will need 50 tons of salt and 30 tons can be stored now. Letter on file.

Fire Chief Wilson and the Trustees discussed automatic response with Columbus.

The Franklin County Emergency/Fire Communications System Plan was discussed. Sharon Township's share of the cost is \$1,265.00. Paul Insley moved to appropriate this amount toward the study, seconded by Larry France. All voted "Aye" thereon.

A noon meeting on 11-2-1981 is scheduled with Larry France and Sutphen regarding one-half of the cost of \$25,200.00 repairs on the aerial platform.

Disc brakes for Engine 101 was discussed. Jake Brake will install Kelsey Hayes Air Disc Brakes for approximately \$1500 plus \$500 labor. Paul Insley moved, seconded by Larry France, to have the brakes installed, not to exceed \$2100. All voted "Aye" thereon. P.O. #15

Legal notice will be published in the Worthington News regarding bids for a Multi-Channel Logging Recorder System. Bids will be received at the 11-4-1981 meeting. See 11-7-1981 minutes.

Chief Wilson discussed the applications for three additional men. He reported that Craig Hall's test score was 81.8%.

Chief Wilson reported on the 8-1-1980 Eligibility List of 16 men. Three have been hired, two eliminated, two moved, one in the National Guard, the other eight are being checked on.

It was reported that Guy Kantak has completed all of his training and is one of the reserves now.

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The Clerk reported that a letter was written to Sutphen Corporation on 10-8-1981 requesting that Rockwell Dura Master Air Disc Brakes be installed on the new piece of equipment for an additional \$1500.00.

A letter dated 10-14-1981 has been received from Sutphen Corporation stating that an extension of three months may be required to install the new brakes. A decision regarding this was tabled until the 11-4-1981 meeting.

Chief Wilson reported on the fire at Little Turtle Condominiums. The Chief, 101 Ladder, and Engine 101 responded. Chief Wilson stated that they were unable to communicate with the Columbus department after they left their vehicles. At least three Walkie Talkies would have solved this problem. A letter will be written to Safety Director, B. Chupka asking him to act on this request to prevent the problem in the future.

Firefighter Lewis Butterfield is eligible for his one year promotion. Paul Insley moved to grant the pay raise, seconded by Larry France. All voted "Aye".

Chief Wilson reported that carpet is being cleaned and floors painted at the firehouse.

Larry France noticed that an area of the roof trim needs repair and instructed Chief Wilson to have it fixed.

Chief Wilson reported on Fire Prevention Week activities. Open House was held on Sunday, October 18. Fire Prevention Programs were held in various schools using "Smokey the Bear". More than \$5,600 was collected for the Childrens Hospital Burn Unit Program.

Police Chief Robert Hale reported that background work is being done on reserve applicants.

Chief Hale requested to attend a Bank Security Seminar on 10-28-1981 to be held at the Sheraton. Request was granted.

A request was made to order 150 Police Dept. patches from Eastern Emblem Manufacturing Corporation at a cost of \$1.89 each. Paul Insley so moved, seconded by Carl Knost. All voted "Aye".

Three long sleeve, winter weight, shirts are needed for Officer Dan Grant. Paul Insley moved to order the shirts, seconded by Carl Knost. All voted "Aye".

A notice will be published in the Worthington News stating that a Police Cruiser will be auctioned on 11-18-1981 at 7:30, minimum bid \$400. Ad will run 10-29, 11-5, 11-12-1981. So moved by Paul Insley, seconded by Carl Knost. All voted "Aye".





The General Revenue Sharing Entitlement Period 13 hearing was held November 18, 1981. The Trustees accepted and enacted the estimated budget.

The Clerk received a letter on December 2, 1981 from the Revenue Sharing Advisory Service stating that President Reagan has proposed a 12% reduction in revenue sharing funding for fiscal year 1982. Letter is on file.

The speed limit reduction request was discussed. On November 18 a letter was written to the Franklin County Engineers concerning this problem. In a reply, dated December 1, it was stated that the Ohio Department of Transportation is the only authority that can reduce speed on county roads. The Trustees instructed the Clerk to write to the OSDT asking them to consider this problem. Also, a letter is to be sent to Mrs. George L. James of Olentangy River Rd. and copies of correspondence, as she has requested Mr. Insley to do something about the speed on Hard Rd. Numerous other residents have also complained.

On August 19, a Resolution was sent to the State Highway Dept. requesting speed limit reductions on Flint Road and Park Road. No reply has been received to date.

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A proposal was received 12-2-81 from Allied Roto Rooter Sewer Service to clean 3000' of storm sewers on Rosslyn Ave. The price of this service is \$80 per hour for equipment and two men at less than 50 working hours, (\$4000). As Mr. Chandler was not available, the Clerk was asked to give a list of the locations of catch basins to Tom Kayati so he can check them out. Catch basins are located on Rosslyn, Kanawha, Clubview, Colony Court, Lookout Point, Mission Hills, Singing Hills, and Highview.

Letters were written to the Franklin County Engineers on November 5 requesting specifications for work on Highview, Clover Dr., Sharon Hill Dr., Rosslyn and Kanawha. As of yet, no reply has been received.

Uniform service for the Road Dept. and Cemetery employees was again discussed. The Clerk will write a letter to the Walnut Grove Cemetery Board of Trustees requesting that they pay one half of the charge for this service.

On December 1, 1981, the Clerk received a letter from Pioneer Mortgage Company regarding the property of Mr. Salyer on Jewett Drive. The Salyer house encroaches onto Hildreth Ave. and violates the building line approximately 20 feet. Mr. Salyer has applied for a loan which cannot be closed until it is certain no problem exists. The Clerk reported that we have started a Cash Management Program with Ohio State Bank as of December 15, 1981 at 11% of checking account balance.

Joint meeting of the Worthington City Council and Sharon Township Trustees was held on November 23, 1981 for the purpose of appointing a Member at Large to a three-year term on the Walnut Grove Cemetery Board of Trustees. Jim Charlton was voted to serve on this board.

The Clerk presented the Estimated Budget for Sharon Township for the year 1982. Copy is on file.

The Trustees discussed insurance coverage. Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France, that since the Trustees have no control over the rates, all coverage be paid up to a limit of \$200.00 per person per month. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Trustees will receive a salary increase effective 1-1-82, \$7,200.00 per year, \$600.00 per month, \$36 per day.

The Consumer Price Indexes from the U.S. Dept. of Labor were received on 12-4-1981. The percent change from one year ago is 10.1 and 0.2 from one month ago.

The Clerk will place an ad in the Worthington News stating the the Trustees will receive sealed bids on January 20 at 8:00 for cleaning and flushing the storm drains on Rosslyn and Kanawha. The ad will be published on Dec. 31, Jan. 7, and 14.

Mr. Chandler reported that Mr. Haycook has applied for township road crew work. He is 24 years old and presently working at a Gas Station. Larry France moved, seconded by Paul Insley, to hire Mr. Haycook and have him start as soon as possible. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Furniture at the fire house was discussed. The present furniture is about 22 years old. Firefighter W. Noble would be able to build new furniture. 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The Firefighter uniforms were discussed. Several times recently the firefighters have been mistaken for police officers. Some change needs to be made to distinguish between the two uniforms, either in color or style.

An inter-divisional communication dated 12-7-81 from Firefighter Frank Henderson was submitted to the Trustees. While delivering L-101 to Sutphen Company, he was involved in a minor accident and has offered to pay for the damage done. Copy on file.

Chief Wilson reported on L-101 which is having rust repair work done at Sutphen Company. Cost will be close to \$10,000.00.

Municipal Court fines in the amount of \$3469.75 have been received, Receipt #48.

A letter dated 12-5-1981 has been received from Dr. Arthur Haimerl, Ascension Lutheran Church, concerning an accident involving his son, Todd. Dr. Haimerl commends Officer Larry Chapman for the way he handled the situation. Letter is on file.

Police Chief Hale submitted a Salary Breakdown for Officers Ridgeway, Chapman, and Grant. This information is beneficial to the Trustees to see exactly the amount of money needed for each man per year. Report is on file.

Chief Hale submitted the resignation of Officer Timothy White which was effective 12-12-1981. Mr. White has taken a position with the City of Zanesville Police Department.

Reserve Police Officer William Tribbie was present to be interviewed by the Trustees for a full-time position with the Police Department. He would be hired to replace Officer White. Mr. Tribbie is 34 years old, married, and has two children, a ten year old daughter and a three year old son. He has received all of his police training and his certificate. He has been a Sharon Township Reserve Officer for one and a half years. His wife approves of his becoming full-time. Larry France moved, seconded by Paul Insley, to hire Mr. Tribbie effective 1-1-1982 at \$14,500 yearly, \$1,208.34 monthly, \$604.17 semi-monthly, \$6.97 hourly. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Ohio Crime Prevention Association will host a two day Police Training Seminar on January 6 and 7 in Toledo, Ohio. The seminar is free of charge and will cover these topics: Internal Theft, Specialized Community Business Programming Efforts, Crime Analysis, and Shoplifting. Larry France moved to register Sgt. Ridgeway for the seminar, second by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon. In the near future, the Trustees would like for the Police Dept. to hold an open meeting at the Township Hall for Township residents.

Chief Hale reported that Mr. O'Brian from Municipal Court has contacted him concerning a Police District explained in Section 505.48 of the Ohio Township Law. The Trustees asked Chief Hale to have Mr. O'Brian explain in writing his reasons for wanting same. They have questions about what happens to remaining township area and General Fund money, etc. A Police District is created by resolution adopted by two-thirds of the Board.
