The following minutes were read and approved. December 19, 1979, January 2, 1980, the December 5, & 7th were re-read.

Clerk asked for nominations for Chairman of the Board for 1980. Carl O. Knost absent from the meeting because of a broken arm- he was contacted by phone just prior to the meeting. He stated that he didnot want to serve as chairman or vice-chairman but wanted to 2nd both. Clerk stated this prior to accepting motion

Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that Paul R. Insley be Chairman for 1980. All Vote "Aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that Larry E. France be Vice-Chairman for 1980. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Sharon township trustees set the first and third Wednesday evening of each month at 7:30 P.M. to sign check and talk with clerk and 8:00 for public. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that Paul R. Insley be appointed to serve on the Walnut Grove Union Cemetery Association Board for 1980. All voted "Aye" thereon. Other members of this board are John Wilbur, Jr. from City Council of Worthington and James Charlton, member at large.

Chairman Paul R. Insley is automatically the member to the Franklin County Board of Health.

Clerk reported that the Ohio State Association of Township Trustees & Clerks Convention will be held January 16,17,18 & 19 at the Columbus Sheraton Motor Hotel. The State board of directors have requested that Eleanor Bierly serve on one of the panels - School for Newly Elected Clerks with the State Auditor's office with Mr. Robert Millisor and Joe Pepple -another Clerk. Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France that expenses to and from and during the convention and auto parking be paid by the township for all trustee and clerk if they are able to attend. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Insley that the vapor lights at Highview at Route #315 and at Clubview and Route #315 be paid for 1980. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France that the mileage rate of 20¢ per mile be set. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France that the Sharon Township Trustees compensation rates be set at the \$22.00 per diem as set by Law. All voted "Aye" thereon. Not to exceed 200 days

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. France that the clerks compensation be set at the \$6,250.00 per yr. as determined by law. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Lots cannot be purchased by Township residents for non-residents for a reduced fee. Fee of \$350.00 must apply. No more spaces than the number of persons in a family are to be sold to any one unless approved by the Board (family being husband, wife, and children at home). Used space must be paid for at the time of burial.

Foundation prices are to correspond with Walnut Grove Cemetery prices. Non-resident indigent burials are not to be accepted. No wooden boxes. Steel, concrete, fiber glass or plastic will be accepted.

Road Supt. reported on Mt. Air Roads. At Lakeshore and Walnut, Mr. K. Worster placed a block of wood in the right of way and it got stuck in the tire tread. Damage will be reported later. Trustees instructed the Police and Supt. to instruct their men to notify the Road Crew when debris is in the roadway.

The Trustees requested the following:

1. Vehicle Log Book of maintenance on each vehicle.
2. Street Maintenance Log Book on each street.
3. Payroll/Time Log Book.
4. Gasoline tank lock to be replaced or tumblers replaced.
5. Building lock to be replaced and list of keys for tank and building are to be kept in a log book.
6. Check on a salt spreader for the pickup truck.
7. Check on a truck to replace the 1974 Ford Dump Truck.
8. All wages are tabled until Form #A-37-3 is received from the Auditor.

A correction was made in the November 29, 1979 minutes. Trustees agreed to pay the Road Crew men weekly instead of the 1st and 16th.

Fire Chief Sanford submitted the 1980 proposed budget for the Fire Department, Service Longevity Report, and Monthly Report for December.

The Clerk read a Memorandum, dated 12-7-1979, concerning the Police and Firemen's Disability and Pension Fund. Effective 3-1-1980, the employee contribution rate will increase from 7% to 8.5%. Employer contribution rate for 1980 is 19.87%.

Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Insley, that Mr. Knost and Mr. Insley be appointed to serve on the Volunteer Firemen's Dependents Fund Board and the Firemen's Pension Fund Board. All voted "Aye" thereon. The two firemen serving on this board are David Torrens (Chairman) and Jerry Wellman (Secretary), the fourth man elected as the non partisan member is Norman Lehman. All are appointed for a one year term.

Regular pay periods (See Chapter II-General Policies and Procedures #222.00 All employees will be paid on the 1st and 16th of each month. Road crew will be paid every Friday, holding back one weeks pay, until further notice.

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Jan Bloomer is to be advanced to the two year man salary on his anniversary date.

J. Lawless and J. Bloomer are to be advanced to Volunteer Firemen. R. Chapman is to be put on the Reserve Payroll.

Volunteer Firemen get paid when they work. Reserves get paid if they are needed to cover for a firemen on duty.

A. R. Wilson requested two new typewriters for the Dispatcher and Fire Prevention Officer. Mr. France moved, ^{OK 387}₂₋₆ seconded by Paul Insley, that the Adler Selector be purchased in the amount of \$840.00 each. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Fire Dept. requested to buy jackets and liners from Central Ohio Sportswear. Volunteer firemen are buying their own and a check of \$588.00 was with the order. Larry France moved, seconded by Paul Insley, that a check for \$675.00, #3692, be issued and sent with the order. All voted "Aye" thereon.

A Professional Data Processing System was discussed. The cost would be about \$27,000.00. Trustees tabled the idea.

Trustees are to meet with Tom Sutphen to discuss repair bills, etc.

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
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

The following were present: Trustees, Larry F. France, and Paul R. Insley. Fire Chief, L. F. Sanford and Assistant Chief A. R. Wilson. Policemen, T. L. Huff and M. Polisen. Road Supt. Harold L. Chandler. Reserve Policeman, Steve Early. Clerk, Eleanor Bierly absent, attending the Ohio State Association of Township Trustees and Clerks convention at the Sheraton in Columbus.

Trustees interviewed Steve Early and spoke about the 1 year Police Probation Period, and about riding in the cruisers. The permission was granted to ride in cruisers.

Police requested a new Walkie Talkie charger in the amount of \$249.00. Tabled.

1. Road Supt. H. L. Chadler reported on road work. Discussed overtime pay according to law.
2. Trustees asked H. L. Chandler for his Police Commission since he has not gone to the meetings and kept up with the required schooling. If he wants to continue as a reserve policeman he must complete the schooling and attend meetings and keep current with schooling. He is to make this decision by next meeting. Feb. 6, 1980.

The Walnut Grove Union Cemetery Association appropriates all of these funds, etc. The Walnut Grove Cemetery is audited by the State of Ohio Examiners with the City of Worthington audit. Sharon Township is audited by same with a township division.

The Trustees of each board feel that the men were paid for time spent for each employer.

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All present repeated the Pledge of Allegiance.

The following were present: Trustees, Paul Insley, Larry France; Clerk, Eleanor Bierly; Fire Chief L. F. Sanford, Asst Fire Chief, A. R. Wilson; Police Chief, R. T. Hale, Officers, T. Huff, M. Polisen, P. Bourgeois, and S. Earley. Attorney, Blake Danner; Pat Sharon of the Franklin County Prosecuting Attorney's Office; approximately 81 Sharon Township Residents.

The Clerk read Form No. A-40-1 from the Franklin County Auditor concerning appropriations for the fiscal year beginning 1-1-1980.

Clerk submitted a copy of "Ohio's Annexation Process". Report is on file.

A Norwich Township Opinion was read by Blake Danner by request.

Township residents were present to discuss the proposed Worthington plan to dissolve Sharon Township. They presented a petition with 144 names on it stating the following: We, the undersigned residents of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio, hereby notify the Sharon Township Trustees of our opposition to any attempt by the City of Worthington, Ohio to change the boundaries of Sharon Township or to change any Township boundaries to make them identical with those boundaries of the City of Worthington, and we further petition the Sharon Township Trustees to resist any such attempts by any and all legal means at their disposal. Petition is on file.

Mr. Blake Danner explained that even if the Franklin County Commissioners approve the request of Worthington, it would be six months or more before it could be completed. The Commissioners would need to clear up Sharon Township assets, adjust the money, make arrangements for Flint Cemetery and Walnut Grove Union Cemetery, etc.

Residents from Homeacre and Hildreth complained about heavy trucks damaging the roads. Larry France moved, seconded by Paul Insley, to order signs for this area. All voted "Aye" thereon. The Clerk will send an order to the Franklin County Engineers, Attn. Lee Pierce, for four 30"x30" "No Thru Trucks" and four 10' posts. When the signs are delivered and installed, the clerk will send a letter to the following businesses informing them of same:

The Road Supt., Harold Chandler, was instructed to make repairs on Homeacre and Hildreth.

Mrs. Wiseman, a resident on Hildreth, stated that there is a vacant, unimproved, unkept lot next to her home. She feels that the underbrush is a fire hazard. The lot is owned by people named Zuckerman. The Trustees told Mrs. Wiseman to find out the lot number and report back to them.

Fire Chief Sanford reported that the Fire Dept. Public Address system needs repair.

Chief Sanford is acquiring roof repair estimates. Also needed is new flashing and down spouts.

Asst. Fire Chief Wilson stated that he has had conversation with Dr. Baker of the Board of Directors, Childrens Home. This concerned the possibility of purchasing a 230'x280' lot for erection of a new fire station at Lattimer & High Streets. After a new location is confirmed, an appraiser will be called for.

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The Fire Prevention Officer needs a place to store old files. The Trustees suggested he store them in the Fire Dept. garage.

The Trustees instructed the Fire Dept. to contact Sheedy Paving for an estimate on driveway repair.

A Notifier Fire Alarm System will be installed at the Worthington Public Library on 3-20-1980. The rate for this service is \$36.00 per year, \$3.00 per month. The Clerk will bill the library for \$27.00 beginning April 1. There are presently 13 accounts. The library account will be #14.

Police Chief Hale submitted the February report from Municipal Court. \$1,371.87 has been received in fines.

Chief Hale reported that three medical first-aid kits have been purchased and placed in the three cruisers.

Report was made regarding cruiser repairs.

The Police Dept. request to hire a sixth full time officer was discussed. Tabled.

Chief Hale presented the possibility of joining Sharon Township Police Dept. with Perry Township Police Dept. The reasons given in favor for doing so are: (1) A Supervisor is available at all times (2) Perry Twp. has a Detective Bureau (3) A Police Dispatcher is on duty at all times. Comments were made by Officers Bourgeois and Polisen. Tabled until 4-16-1980 meeting.

Fire Fighter, Mike Tippett, is due for a step increase in pay. It was approved, effective 3-31-1980.

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The following were present: Trustees, Paul Insley and Larry France; Road Supt. Harold Chandler; Police Chief, Robert T. Hale; Fire Chief, Ray Wilson.

All present repeated the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

Harold Chandler reported on the Road Dept.

The Board of Trustees instructed Mr. Chandler to make an attempt to employ additional people.

The Supt. was instructed to check Plumtree and West St. and make a recommendation at the April 16 meeting.

Mr. Chandler reported a water problem on Meeklyn. He was instructed to tell Mrs. Voss that the tile is not Township responsibility.

It was reported that the ditch on Hildreth needs cleaning.

Bonnie Bowman, 885-7169, has inquired about resurfacing Bertson Place and Melyers.

Mr. Chandler reported that Steve Earley has turned in his resignation effective April 4, 1980. The resignation was accepted.

Police Chief Hale submitted the monthly report for March.

Chief Hale reported that Sgt. Huff turned in a letter of resignation, dated 3-28-1980, and effective 4-15-1980. He has requested his two weeks vacation pay and pay for comp time. Resignation was accepted. Pay was approved.

Pierre Bourgeois has also given a letter of resignation, dated 3-27-1980, and effective 4-13-1980. It was requested to pay him for his comp time. Resignation was accepted. Pay approved.

Chief Hale requested to hire Steve Earley as of 4-1-80 at a salary of \$10,700 and Ed Griffin as of 4-16-1980 at a salary of \$11,000. Larry France moved to hire these two men, seconded by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Chief Wilson submitted the Fire Dept. Inventory.

Rev. Hicks has requested that the fire hydrant at Bertson and Melyers be checked.

Chief Wilson turned in the overtime records. It was approved for payment.

The Chief turned in his expenses for the Memphis trip plus \$44.00 in cash. The Trustees agreed to reimburse him for additional expenses.

The Fire Dept. has signed a service contract for defibrillators.

The Trustees have signed a Mutual Aid Contract with the City of Columbus in agreement with Ordinance No. 803-74.

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Chief Wilson reported the need for Columbus Fire, four channel Frequency Radios. Used ones run \$1100 each. New ones are between \$1200 and \$1300. Mr. France moved, seconded by Mr. Insley to order two General Electric, new, Model MVP radios for \$1199 each plus installation. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Clerk has received a letter from Blue Cross, Blue Shield dated 3-17-80, stating that they cannot list William Fields's brother-in-law on his family contract. Letter is on file.

Copy of a letter has been received to the Board of Tax Appeals, State of Ohio, from Bruce E. Bailey, Asst. City Attorney for the City of Westerville. The letter is in regard to Case No. 80-E-21, Local Government. Letter placed on file: County Budget, Local Government, Misc.

The Annual Township Highway System Mileage Report as determined by the Director of Transportation for 1979 was received. A revision has been signed by the Clerk Eleanor Bierly, Chairman of the Board, Paul Insley, and Trustee Carl Knost.

Notification has been received, 3-25-1980, of a Franklin County Rural Zoning Commission public hearing on 4-21-1980 on Case No. 79-45. Application has been made to change zoning of 6.2 acres in Sharon Township.

Clerk has received a survey from the Ohio Bureau of Employment Services, 4-1-1980, to measure total employment. It has been completed and returned April 23, 1980.

A Contract for Emergency Mutual Aid between the village of Plain City and Sharon Township has been signed.

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The following were present: Trustees, Larry E. France, Paul R. Insley, Carl O. Knost; Clerk, Eleanor A. Bierly; Road Supt. Harold L. Chandler; Fire Chief, A. Ray Wilson; Police Chief, Robert T. Hale; Attorney Blake Danner; and 84 guests.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was said. Minutes of the April 2 meeting were read and approved.

The Clerk presented the Statement of Semi-Annual Apportionment of Taxes. On file.

A letter dated 4-7-1980, was received from the Office of Revenue Sharing concerning general revenue sharing payment. Letter is on file.

A letter from Gene Wetherholt, of the Prosecuting Attorneys office dated 4-8-1980, stated that the Trustees should pay the amounts indicated by the Industrial Relations for employees overtime. Paul Insley and Larry France voted "Aye" with Carl Knost voting "No". The Clerk was instructed to send a letter with the checks to the Industrial Relations Board stating that the Trustees protest the paying of said findings. The Clerk will telephone Mr. Wetherholt telling him that he will receive a copy of the letter and checks.

The Franklin County Engineers and Sharon Township Trustees will have a joint meeting on 3-17-1980 at 9:30 A.M.

The Ohio Bureau of Employment Services have made a Determination of Benefits, 4-7-1980, on claimant James F. Messenger. Mr. Messenger has been determined ineligible for benefits.

An update was given on Worthington's proposal to reduce Sharon Township to their boundaries and taking over the Fire Dept.

Mr. Kevin R. Cox, 111 Forest Ridge Drive, Worthington, submitted a petition stating "We the undersigned wish to express our opposition to the plan proposed by the City of Worthington to eliminate those parts of Sharon Township presently lying beyond the boundaries of the City of Worthington. In addition we respectfully request that the Sharon Township Trustees do all in their power to oppose the implementation of this plan." It has 125 signatures on it. Petition placed on file.

The Trustees told the residents present that if there is any change in the Township boundaries or more information, a notice will be placed in the Worthington News, Clintonville Booster, and Suburban North.

The next meeting for this discussion will be May 21, 1980, at 8:00 P.M.

Mr. Taylor of 184 Westview requested the Sharon Township Trustees to contact the Electric Co. Mr. Russell, 464-7237, regarding a cost survey and to determine the number of lights that should be erected on Westview. Four owners have had lights erected and they are billed by the Electric Company.

Harold Chandler reported that Earl Hesson has requested re-employment. The Trustees authorized Mr. Chandler to rehire Mr. Hesson if he wants to. Mr. Hesson would be considered a new employee. He would have to work six months before being paid for holidays; receiving sick leave; and one year before vacation eligibility.

The Road Supt. submitted a list of tools needed for that department. The estimated cost is \$1056.08. He was authorized to purchase the tools. *11395 5-9-80*

The Trustees informed Mr. Chandler that they are not satisfied with the employee time cards.

A letter, dated 4-12-1980, has been received from Mr. Ziggy Coyle, 4944 Sharon Hill Drive, Worthington. Mr. Coyle requested the Trustees to consider the surfaces of Sharon Hill Drive and Clover Drive.

Mr. Darryl R. Montgomery, President of Columbus Slurry Seal, Inc., in a letter dated 4-8-1980, introduced Joe Kindler. Mr. Kindler is a new vice-president of the company. He asked that they be placed on the bidders notification list.

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Jean Kuhn, Community Park, made a complaint regarding drainage at 6770 Maple Canyon. Joan Wiseman requested that the drainage be checked on Homeacre. The Trustees stated that if water is standing on any lots, the Franklin County Board of Health should be contacted.

Sandy Shough inquired about the "No Thru Trucks" signs order at the 3-19-1980 meeting. The signs are not ready yet.

Rev. Hicks requested at the 4-2-1980 meeting that the fire hydrant at Melyers and Bertson be checked. Ray Wilson stated that fire hydrants are checked twice a year, every April and October.

Stanley Shultz was hired as a dispatcher 1-15-1970 and as a fireman 2-15-1971. Chief Wilson requested that Mr. Shultz be placed in the ten year bracket for vacation time. Mr. Knost moved to do so, seconded by Mr. France. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Chief Wilson requested that the Trustees pay compensation to personnel who take over for officers for more than a 24 hour period. Mr. Wilson was instructed to report back to the Trustees with an estimate of the cost for a one year period.

The Fire Dept. has received three estimates for roof repairs (see 4-2-1980 minutes). Because of the great difference in the estimates, the Trustees decided that an architect should be contacted for specifications. The Fire Dept. will advertise for more bids.

The Ohio Arson School will be held at the Marriott Inn, Hamilton Road, August 4 thru August 8, 1980. Paul Insley moved, seconded by Carl Knost, to register Fire Inspector, Marvin Sells, at a fee of \$100.00. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The International Association of Fire Instructors Conference will be held in Miama, Florida, Sept. 28 thru Oct. 2, 1980. Carl Knost moved, seconded by Larry France, to send the Sharon Township Trustees membership, to register Chief Wilson, and pay his expenses to and from the Conference. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The purchase of a Mini-Pumper was discussed. It could replace three pieces of equipment, the Medic 102, Ford Pumper, and Grassfire Unit.

Chief Wilson is working on specifications for a new squad.

Mr. Robert Daines, Battalion Chief for Columbus, has requested an interview with the Trustees for the Fire Chief position.

Chief Wilson has contacted Mike Sheeding Paving regarding the driveway pavement three times. His calls have not been returned. Therefore, Chief Wilson was instructed to contact Richard LeCrone Paving

Police Chief Robert Hale reported that \$1,769.38 has been received in Municipal Court fines for March.

The Clerk has received the Ohio Bureau of Employment Services Employer's Quarterly Payroll Report for January, February, and March. It has been completed and returned April 23, 1980.

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The Trustees approved payment of \$679.00 to Mr. Blake Danner, Township Attorney, from the Revenue Sharing Funds.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that the following adjustments be made within the Revenue Sharing Funds. (Feb. 20, 1980 Appropriations)



Names obtained of guests are: Sharon Hills residents, Jack Baird, W. Stephens, Mr. & Mrs. Vern Davis, Mr. Albretch, and Emerson Ave. resident, Mrs. Mingus.

The Pledge of Allegiance was repeated.

Minutes were read and approved of the 7-16-1980 and 7-30-80 meetings.

The Clerk presented the Operating Fund Statement as of 8-1-1980.

In a Resolution at the 7-16-1980 meeting, the Trustees voted to request \$100,000.00 advance of taxes from the County Auditor. This money was received on 7-25-1980, Receipt #103, and the Clerk purchased a \$50,000.00 CD for 34 days at 6½%, maturing 8-28-1980.

The Clerk has received from the Franklin County Auditor, a letter dated 8-1-1980 and a check for \$13.60 which is interest on a Series D-Term Note, Penn Central Interest Distribution. Receipt #110.

Road Supt. Harold Chandler reported that the mowing of berms has been completed.

Mr. Chandler is repairing the tar kettle. He stated that it needs new tires.

In May, the Trustees notified the Franklin County Engineers that they want the following roads to be surface treated: Plum Tree Drive, Mulberry Drive, Edgecliff Drive, Bertson Place, Melyers Court, and the driveway and front ramp at the fire house. Mr. Chandler is to check with the Engineers about when this work is scheduled to be done.

Mr. & Mrs. Vern E. Davis of Sharon Hills were present to talk to the Trustees about a drainage problem in their neighborhood as stated in a letter dated 7-16-1980. Water from Wishing Well Acres, land of Mrs. Welshimer, could be drained to the north to a small stream. Mr. Dick Davidson, a drainage engineer with the Franklin County Engineers, stated that a drainage system should be planned. The state put in ditch tile under Route 315. He will inquire about another tile being put in. Mr. Insley will check into this problem further.

A letter from Franklin County Engineer, Edward Honton, dated 7-25-1980, was read regarding an estimate to surface treat Sharon Hill Drive and Clover Drive. The Engineers do not recommend this be done at the present time as the road is only cracking in a few areas. They suggest paint patching. Estimate is \$1650.00.

Mr. Ziggy Coyle, Sharon Hill Drive, requested in a letter dated 7-17-1980, that the Trustees consider repairing Sharon Hill Drive and Clover Drive.

Mrs. Mingus, of Emerson & Kanawha, was present to complain about dust on her street, curbs, and lack of speed bumps. She asked about the surface width of Emerson as she would like to park a boat on the easement. The Clerk checked the Ohio Dept. of Transportation Road Inventory; road width is 16' and the surface width is 10'. Mr. Insley will talk to Mrs. Mingus further at 460-2205.

Mr. France has all the insurance policies and the fleet insurance bids.

Chief Wilson reported that there is a crack in the Yoke Ladder Truck. This could be a design defect or caused by the two accidents it was involved in. This is under warranty. Cost will be about \$3600.00 and our cost will be \$650.00. It is scheduled to go in the garage on 8-7-1980 and will be returned about 4:30 on 8-8-1980.

Chief Wilson submitted a statement signed by Bradley Troy concerning release of liability in reference to his part-time employment as radio dispatcher. Statement is on file.

Chief Wilson submitted a letter, 8-5-1980, to the Trustees assessing the needs of the Fire Dept. in terms of additional apparatus, office and storage space for present and future. Discussion followed about the possibilities of remodeling the present firehouse, building a new one, or doing nothing. If it is decided to build, the steps involved would be to advertise for property which would be approximately \$150,000.00; 6-9% architect fees for plans; receiving construction bids; and the actual building process. R. J. Palencar, Architect, has probably built the last ten fire houses in Franklin County, the last being for Jackson Township. Mr. France will check with the Prosecuting Attorney regarding the proper procedure to follow.

Repair of the fire house roof was again discussed. Three bids have been received. See 4-2-1980 and 4-16-1980 minutes. Tabled.

Police Chief Hale submitted the monthly report for the Police Dept.

Chief Hale reported that Reserve salaries for July totaled \$288.00. Sgt. Ridgeway took two weeks vacation in July and Officer Polisenno took five days comp. time.

Chief Hale talked about the Police Budget and the need to replace cruisers with new ones or used State Highway Patrol cruisers. The Trustees told the Chief to get three bids for new cruisers and also get an estimate of the cost for used Highway Patrol cruisers.

Chief Hale and Perry Twp. Police Chief, Robert Perlman, registered citizens for Crime Alert at the Olentangy Valley Shopping Center on July 26 & 27. Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Larry France, that the Sharon Township Trustees contract with Jack Maxton Chevrolet for a new economy size auto, also, that the Trustees purchase the 1979 Chevrolet from Maxton. All voted "Aye" thereon.

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The following were present: Trustees, Larry France, Paul Insley, Carl Knost; Clerk, Eleanor Bierly; Road Supt., Harold Chandler; Police Chief, Robert Hale, Sgt. Don Ridgeway; Fire Chief, Ray Wilson.

Minutes of the October 15 meeting were read and approved.

The Financial Report as of November 1 was submitted.

Police Chief Hale submitted the montly report for October for the Police Department.

New police cruisers were discussed. Chief Hale was instructed to obtain three quotes. The Trustees requested to see a list of repairs for each of the three present cruisers.

The Police Department requested to purchase three, 200 ft. sections of rope. Carl Knost so moved, seconded by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon.

A water line was placed across Olentangy Blvd. between Rosslyn and Kanawha. The Police Dept. will notify Woody Excavating to repair the road to its former condition.

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Fire Chief Wilson reported that repairs on the firehouse roof were started on November 3.

Fire Investigator, Marvin Sells, requests to be registered for a Fire/Arson Detection Course given at the Ohio Fire Academy on December 6 & 7, fee \$15.00. Mr. Knost moved to register Mr. Sells, seconded by Mr. Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Chief Wilson requested to order four Officers Shields (badges), four Firefighter Shields. Carl Knost so moved, seconded by Paul Insley. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Clerk has received a survey regarding a "Pavement Marking Program for Railroads", from the Ohio Dept. of Transportation, 10-15-1980. The participation rate may be 10% of the costs. The only crossing in ST is on Park Rd. in Flint.

The Clerk received a ^{copy of a} letter from the Worthington Hills Civic Association, 10-21-1980, to Mr. Dodge, Director of Columbus Parks and Recreation. The letter is in regard to extending the Olentangy Bike Path.
