Lots cannot be purchased by township residents for non-residents for a reduced fee. Fee of \$400.00 must apply. No more spaces than the number of persons in a family are to be sold to anyone unless approved by the Board of Township Trustees. (Family being husband, wife, and children living at home.) Used space must be paid for at the time of burial.

No funerals are to be scheduled on Saturday afternoon or Sunday without the approval of the Superintendent. No non-resident indigent burials are to be accepted.

No monument, stone or marker is to be removed from any grave space unless written permission has been granted from the Sharon Township Trustees. Clerk must have written notice on file from the low owner and/or relatives requesting the removal of same.

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No funeral flowers are to be removed from the grave site unless permission has been granted by a member of the family in the presence of the Superintendent. Artificial flowers are banned. Fraternal and other emblems will be permitted for Thirty (30) days following a burial and then will be removed.

No deed will be issued until the lot is paid for in full.

Accounts are to be paid in full within 90 days. No interest is charged. A fee of \$10 to \$25 is retained as a service charge on lots repurchased by Sharon Township Trustees. Fee governed by Board.

Mr. Chandler stated that Tom Kayati is on the Walnut Grove Cemetery payroll. He recommended to the Trustees that Mr. Kayati be transferred to Sharon Township Road Department. David Bachelor so moved, second by John Butterfield. All voted "Aye".

The Road Dept. radio system was discussed.

Police Sgt. Don Ridgeway submitted the Police Monthly Report for December.

A letter was received dated December 15, 1983 from Ohio Dept. of Administrative Services regarding purchase of used Highway Patrol vehicles. Letter placed on file.

Municipal Court fines for the month of November, 1983 have been received in the amount of \$2,535.63, receipt #75.

On December 23, 1983, \$38.00 was received from the Governor's Highway Safety Program. This is re-imbusement for alcohol testing done for the Police Dept. by the testing lab. This program was for a one year period and has now expired.

A letter of commendation was received from Fred Fahrenbach for Chief Hale and Sgt. Ridgeway. They helped him open his car when he had locked the keys inside, December 22, 1983. Letter placed on file.

Dispatching was discussed. Consideration is being given to Kara Akins, Reserve Police Officer, to be used as a part time dispatcher to work on Saturdays, fill in for vacation and holidays, etc. A school for police dispatchers will be offered by the Bureau of Criminal Investigation in London, Ohio from Feb. 21-24, 1984, \$60 per student. Mr. Butterfield moved, second by Mr. Bachelor, to enroll Kara Akins, Donna Baranek, Judy Eastman, Jan Bloomer, and Howard Parent. All voted "Aye" thereon.

A letter has been received from Barry R. Robinson of Porter, Wright, Morris & Arthur, Attorneys, regarding the estate of Lucilla F. Wright. The will of Mrs. Wright bequests a considerable amount of money to the Sharon Township Firefighter's Association or its successor. A letter will be written to the Prosecuting Attorney regarding the handling of this matter.

The application for Emergency Medical Service Grant was discussed. (See minutes of December 7, 1983). Chief Wilson is working on vehicle specifications.

Firefighter Howard Foust, hired December 20, 1983, transferred from Plain City Fire Dept. to Sharon Township Fire Dept. He had 560 hours of accumulated sickleave. Mr. Bachelor moved, second by Mr. Butterfield, that we pick up 168 of these hours. All voted "Aye".

The benefits package, dental, health, longevity, and pay scales were again discussed. Chief Wilson submitted a new pay schedule as of December 1, 1983. Also submitted was the projected budgets for the years 1983 through 1991 for the Fire Department.

A Statement of Assurances was received from the Office of Revenue Sharing on December 8, 1983. It was signed by the Clerk and returned the same day. Notification of receipt of the statement by the Treasury Dept. was received in our office on January 11, 1984.

The Cost of Living for August, September, October, and November was 1.4%. Mr. Bachelor moved, second by Mr. Insley, that this amount be granted to all eligible employees. All voted "Aye".

The following were present: Trustees, David Bachelor, John Butterfield, Paul Insley; Clerk, Eleanor Bierly; Road Supt. Harold Chandler; Fire Chief, Ray Wilson; Guests, Jack Bachtel, representative from Planned Communities John Circle, Franklin County Engineer, Charlotte Circle.

Minutes of the May 2 meeting were read and approved.

The Financial Report as of May 1, 1984 was submitted.

Mr. Jack Bachtel appeared before the board to discuss Planned Communities development of the property adjacent to Flint Cemetery. He inquired about trading ten acres of flat land for land along Flint Road. The Trustees and Mr. Chandler, Flint Cemetery Superintendent, are to view the area on Monday, May 21 at 2:00 P.M. before making any decision.

Franklin County Engineer, John Circle, appeared before the board on behalf of Northland Community Council to discuss Jewett Road. Mr. Circle stated that Jewett Road from Maple Canyon Road west about 100 feet to the Columbus corporation line should be opened to help the flow of traffic in the northeast quadrant. The Trustees questioned the cost of this proposal. It is estimated that it would cost \$10,000 for the 100 feet in question. Mr. Circle wants Columbus to pay 1/3, Sharon Township to pay 1/3, and the County would pick up 1/3. However, Columbus is not interested in the project. The Trustees feel that Columbus might annex the area after the Township invested money in the road. No action was taken.

Form OH-3 for use in the Federal General Revenue Sharing Program has been completed for fiscal year ending December 31, 1983. Legal Notice will be placed in the Worthington News on May 24 stating that the form is available for viewing at the Clerk's office.

Budget Forms A-32-3 were received May 4 from the Franklin County Budget Commission. Forms must be filed before July 20, 1984. This is the Estimated Budget for 1985.

Mrs. Myra Lee Neisser appeared before the board to discuss her accident of 2-16-1983 when placing her trash near a storm sewer lid at Singing Hills Lane. In her letter of 11-22-1983 to Larry E. France, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, she requested \$2,000.00 to defray her medical costs. A letter was written to the Franklin County Prosecuting Attorney on 12-13-1983 regarding same. All information was mailed to that office. Trustees Insley and Bachelor thought that the former Trustee Chairman, Mr. France, had contacted the insurance company. A letter will be written to Ms. Kline informing her that the weeds will be cut three times this summer and she will be billed \$400.00.

Weed Notices have also been sent to Thomas & Dianne Persinger, 1103 Lanning Dr. Columbus regarding Lot #4 Section #1 Parcel #6683 Clubview Blvd. Worthington and to James D. Salvatore, 777 Clubview Blvd. regarding Parcel #6682, Clubview Blvd. Worthington.

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Several residents from the Community Park area were present to talk to the Trustees about the proposed opening of Jewett Dr. to Maple Canyon. They submitted a petition with 50 signatures in opposition to the opening.

Mr. Steve Harper, 1280 Homeacre, inquired about speed bumps for Hildreth. Also requested was more police patrolling, road repairs, better drainage for the Community Park area.

The Trustees requested Road Supt. Harold Chandler to submit a written schedule of work for July, August, and September.

Mr. Chandler reported that Edgecliff has had drainage work done and blacktop. Riverside and Emerson have been repaired. Catch basins have been cleaned in the Flint Rd. area. He does not feel there is excessive gravel on Sharon Hills. The Trustees requested Mr. Chandler to check the drain tile on Beech by the Art Bradley property.

Road employee, Tom Kayati was married on June 10 and his wife will be added to Health One.

Homeacre repair and surface treatment is scheduled for July 23. Hildreth needs Franklin County Engineers specifications.

The Worthington Hills 4th of July Festivities were discussed. David Pickney, 888-7203, is in charge of special duty police officers. Fire Chief Ray Wilson stated that they will need to get a permit for fireworks. Chief Hale is to relay this information to the persons in charge.

Police Chief Robert Hale requested to promote Sgt. Don Ridgeway to Lieutenant. The Trustees requested Chief Hale to submit a job description by the July 11 meeting, objective of smooth team work between Sgt. Ridgeway and Sgt. Allen, Reserves.

Chief Hale requested to buy four Walkie Talkies, estimate of \$1,000 each. The Trustees gave him the go ahead to draw up specifications and advertise.

The Trustees instructed Chief Hale to check closer on the traffic in Community Park area.

Chief Hale reported that he has received verification of the time he worked for Perry Township. Sgt. Ridgeway has not received his yet.

Fire Chief Ray Wilson submitted written statements from Dispatchers Baranek, Eastman, and Parent and Lt. Wing regarding Kara Akins. Miss Akins has been on six months probation. She has been late two times plus $\frac{1}{2}$ hour late when attending dispatcher school in London. Because of her attitude problem, Chief Wilson recommends she be given the opportunity to resign or be terminated. So moved by Mr. Butterfield, second by Mr. Bachelor. All voted "Aye".

New fire hose has been ordered through Mifflin Township Trustees, \$17,125.00. Chief Wilson stated that he was able to save approximately \$8,000.00 this way.

Employee Performance Appraisal was submitted for firefighter Ernie VanHoose. Mr. Bachelor moved to raise him from the two year step to the three year step, second by Mr. Butterfield. All voted "Aye".

Volunteer firefighter David Roggenkamp, submitted a letter of application to be considered for a full time position on the Sharon Township Fire Department. Letter dated June 20, 1984 and placed on file.

Chief Wilson stated that he would like to test for a new eligibility list at a cost of approximately \$8.00 per man.

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Chief Wilson reported that plans for new landscaping are nearly complete. Buckeye Landscape is scheduled to begin work in July. Approximate cost of installing a sprinkler system is \$1,950.00, but the men could do the work themselves at a cost of \$800.00. The Wright inheritance could be used for this project. It should be done prior to Buckeye beginning work.

Notice was received from the Franklin County Board of County Commissioners regarding a public hearing on Case #84-9, 1.193 acres on the east side of Olentangy River Road. Application is to change from a Rural District to a Suburban Office and Institutional District.

David Bachelor reported that he attended the meeting of the Sharon Memorial Board on July 10 to discuss with the Board the need to install a ramp to meet requirements of the Revenue Sharing Requirements for Handicapped (see minutes of Feb. Mar. Apr. May, June). Mr. Bachelor has contacted an architect for this project.

A letter was received from the Sharon Township Memorial Board thanking the road crew for removing the tree near the driveway so it could be widened. Also the Trustees were thanked for having the parking lot and driveway blacktopped. Letter placed on file.

Chief Wilson has registered to attend the International Association of Fire Chiefs from 9-30-84 to 10-3-84 in Los Angeles. Registration has been sent in the amount of \$90.00. Expenses to and from will be approximately \$1,487 by air or \$1,435 to drive. Mr. Bachelor moved to approve the expenses, seconded by Mr. Butterfield. All voted "Aye".

Police Chief Robert Hale submitted two bids for four, hand held, portable, two-way radios. Motorola Communicatons and Electronics, Inc. bid was \$3,412.00. 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


The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

On Monday, August 27, the Sharon Township Road Department surface treated Home Acre Dr. and Hildreth Ave. The edge of Home Acre was built up with asphalt, a coating of tar and then gravel was applied. A topcoat was then applied to prevent a problem with dust. For some reason, the topcoat remained sticky and did not set up as fast as when previously used on other roads. The above mentioned residents were present to talk to the Trustees and the Road Superintendent about tar on their cars, clothes, and inconveniences in regard to the road condition. Two residents each submitted two estimates for having the tar removed from their cars. Copies were made and filed. After a lengthy discussion, the Trustees apologized to the residents for the problem and stated that their intent was to improve Home Acre Dr. and Hildreth Ave. because they believe tax-paying residents of the township deserve to have good roads. The Trustees asked the residents what they would like to have done now. It was stated that the topcoat has set up pretty well by now, but it is feared that if the weather becomes very hot, the stickiness will return. If so, they would like to have a thin layer of gravel applied. The Trustees stated that they will monitor the road. They told the residents to turn in all estimates which would be turned into the township insurance company and assured them the claims will be taken care of. The Trustees were asked to go to the parking lot to view the tar on the cars, which the Trustees agreed to.

Upon returning, the Trustees talked to Mr. Chandler about the road. It was decided that in the future when this kind of work is done, residents should be notified that the road will be completely closed until it is safe to drive on. This present problem was in no way anticipated and was unavoidable.

Mr. Butterfield asked Mr. Chandler about the schedule and method of notifying residents concerning leaf pickup. Leaves are not picked until late in the fall and printed notices are delivered to the residents prior to the date of pickup.

Fire Chief Ray Wilson reported that the 5 inch hose which was ordered has come in and is being tested before putting it into service.

Chief Wilson reported that the Columbus Civil Service recently held a hearing regarding the testing of fire applicants. He was on a fire run and missed the meeting. Because no one showed up to talk for or against it, no action was taken and the meeting will be rescheduled but not for at least ten days. He will notify the Civil Service that he is still interested and request to be put back on the agenda. On September 22, Chief Wilson is leaving for Los Angeles to attend a Chiefs Conference. If the meeting is scheduled during this time, Capt. Overstreet will attend. Our written test cannot be given until this is settled with the Commission.

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Held

September 5

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Chief Wilson reported that he still needs to hire a part-time dispatcher to cover every Saturday, 10 to 12 weeks of vacation per year, and any extended sickleave. These times are presently covered by other personnel. The starting pay is \$5.55 per hour for a maximum of 1200 hours per year. Stan Shultz, who recently retired from the department as a fulltime firefighter has indicated to Chief Wilson that he is interested in the dispatcher position. Chief Wilson would recommend hiring Mr. Shultz for many reasons. He is well qualified and knows the fire department procedures, he would need no training, he is able to work on short notice, and can work an unlimited number of hours without effecting his service pension. No action can be taken until Mr. Shultz turns in an application. Mr. Shultz understands that he would receive no benefits of any kind except for Workers Compensation.

Work is being completed on the apparatus room floor in the front building. The old finish has been stripped off almost completely. The man hired to do the work is waiting for a grinder machine to remove the last of the finish. The floor will then be neutralized. The firefighters will put the finish process on themselves.

Chief Wilson reported about a meeting he had with three Battalion Chiefs in regard to the number of fire runs Sharon Township makes to Little Turtle. The plans for the future are that as soon as the new station is open at Little Turtle, Sharon Township will no longer be automatically dispatched on alarms there. They will be called only if necessary. Sharon Township responded to 129 calls in Little Turtle last year and approximately 90 so far this year.

Mr. Butterfield asked Chief Wilson what plans are being made in preparation for Fire Prevention Month. Chief Wilson reported that they have an ongoing program in grades 2, 6, and 10 of the schools. Sertoma has a program called "Safety Town". Open House will be held on Sunday of Fire Prevention Week with educational exhibits set up which is coordinated by Marvin Sells. Fire Prevention Week is October 7 through 13.

Police Chief Hale expressed his gratitude to Chief Wilson and Lt. Wing for the cooperation of the Fire Department when there was a drowning in Flint Lake on August 23. There was a brief discussion of this incident.

Mr. Bachelor stated to Chief Hale that he had received a complaint from the Road Crew regarding a response for assistance during road work. Chief Hale explained that he was unable to honor the request as it was made the morning following the above mentioned drowning and he was tied up in the office on followup details. Lt. Ridgeway was in court and Chief Hale was the only officer on duty. It was felt that the problem arose from a lack of communication between the two departments.

The Trustees stated that the residents in the Community Park area feel there is a speed problem in the area. The residents feel the speed limit should be more strictly enforced. Mr. Butterfield stated that we would work at ways of bridging the gap between the residents and the Police Department.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 P.M.

The following were present: Trustees, David Bachelor, John Butterfield, Paul Insley; Clerk, Eleanor Bierly; Road Supt. Harold Chandler; Police Chief, Robert Hale; Fire Chief, Ray Wilson; Guest, Pat Shepherd.

All present repeated the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of the November 7, 1984 meeting were read and approved.

Pat Shepherd, representative from Blue Cross/Blue Shield, was present to talk to the Trustees about life insurance and dental coverage. Life insurance rate is .34/\$1,000, accidental death is .06/\$1,000, total of \$168.00 per month per insured. Mrs. Shepherd explained that under the dental program there is a \$50 deductible amount per person each year and a maximum benefit of \$750 per person each year. Preventive services are paid 100% and other basic services are paid at 80% or 50%. Rate is \$8.84 per single and \$26.68 per family monthly. All information is placed on file. No decision was made at this time.

The Worthington City Council and Sharon Township Trustees met in joint session on November 12 and reappointed Joe Miller to a three year term on the Walnut Grove Cemetery Board of Trustees, 1-1-85/12-31-87.

The Clerk reported that Ken Carey of Lauterbach & Eilber Insurance requested a list of all employees, their social security number, date of birth, and position. The list has been compiled and forwarded to Mr. Carey.
