Dear Sir:-

We acknowledge receipt of your letter of March 14th, 1930, concerning the construction of a cinder walk along the state road in your township, known as North High Street.

We assume that the walk is to be constructed outside of municipal corporation limits, and also that abutting property owners will consent to the construction of the walk.

1. Under the facts and circumstances mentioned in your letter, there will be no objection to the township trustees cooperating with the state highway department in constructing a cinder walk to be used by school children and other pedestrians. As we understand the case, the state highway department has agreed to construct the walk, provided the township trustees will furnish the cinders and deliver them at locations designated by the state director. The cost of furnishing and delivering the cinders may be paid from the township or road funds.

2. However, if any property owners abutting on the public highway are opposed to the construction of the cinder path in front of their property, the safe course for the township trustees to pursue would be to follow the statutory procedure outlined in Section 7205 and 7206, General Code. Under these statutes, the cost of constructing the walk could be assessed against property owners or paid by the township, as therein provided. See, 1928 Opinions of Attorney General, 1420.


