The December 16, 1970 minutes were read and approved.

Clerk submitted the 1970 Operating Fund Statement as of December 31, 1970. The Worthington Savings Bank Statement.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Nichols that Mr. Knost be appointed to serve as the Township member to Walnut Grove Cemetery Association. All voted "Aye" thereon. (Starting a 2year term)**

Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that Mr. Nichols be appointed to serve on the Volunteer Firemen's Dependents Fund Board and the Firemen's Pension Fund Board. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that prior to granting of any annual vacation to any township employee, that the trustees and clerk be notified and that any deviation there from be called to the attention of the trustees and clerk. All voted "Aye" thereon.

RESOLUTION 1-1971

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Worthington, Ohio;

That, Orban J. Barker be re-employed and designated as Sharon Township Police Constable.

That the compensation of Constable Barker be set at \$480.38 per month (Increase of 5% from 1970) \$5,764.56 per year, payable on the 1st and 15th of each month for keeping the peace and protecting the property and performing the duties as a police constable, to have a two weeks vacation, and have a \$1,000.00 Police Constable Bond, that the radio maintenance and the purchase of uniforms be paid by the Township, subject to review and approval from the board. That the Township pay for gasoline used in the cruiser for patrolling the roads.

Mr. Knost seconded the Resolution. All voted "Aye"

Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that Harold L. Chandler be reappointed as Sharon Township Road Supt. and Flint Cemetery Supt; that his compensation be set at \$88.00 per week - basis being 20 hours @ \$4.40 per hour - for his duties as Road Supt.-10 hours - Flint Cemetery Supt.-10 hours. That he be authorized to employee emergency help (such as snow removal) and compensation of same not to exceed \$2.50 per hour. All other permanent employees to be hired by the Trustees. All voted "Aye". (Two week vacation)

Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that, Gene Moore, (hired 9-1969) hourly wage be \$3.75; that he receive a two week vacation* at the discretion of the Road Supt. and approval of the board. All voted "Aye". (*to be scheduled)

Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that, James Messenger (hired 10-1969) hourly wage be \$3.50; that he receive a two week vacation* at the discretion of the Road Supt. (*to be scheduled) and approval of the board. All voted "Aye".

Trustees are to take inventory on the second Monday in January - one copy to be filed with Franklin County Engineers - on the following:

4. Road Equipment
5. Fire Department

Mr. Knost reported that the Mercury vapor lights would be installed at the township garage in about 5 wks. (Approx. 2-8-71)

Road Supt. requested that several new street signs, stop signs & posts be ordered. Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that said signs be ordered. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Fire Chief and Trustees discussed unfinished work in the new addition to the Fire House. Clerk instructed to send following list to Warren Smith, Architect, requesting this work to be completed:

in the east west hall
3. Finish trim on the inside top section of the shower room.

Fire Chief reported receiving a letter of resignation and/or leave of absence dated January 4, 1971 from David E. Smith to be effective January 18, 1971, retaining his status as a volunteer fireman. Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that resignation be accepted. All voted "Aye" thereon.

The Volunteer Firemen's Dependent Fund Board was discussed. Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that James L. Nichols and Carl O. Knost be appointed to serve as the Sharon Township Trustees Representatives. All voted "Aye" thereon. Fire Department representatives are William Oden and Jerry Wellman. Norman Lehman is the fifth member.

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RESOLUTION #4

SHARON TOWNSHIP FULL TIME FIREMEN'S REGULATIONS
Rules & Operating Policies

- A. Paid men while on duty at the fire house are under the supervision of the Fire Chief, or next ranking officer in the Chief's absence.
- B. Classification will be firemen: Under Firemen's Relief & Pension Fund (7%) of wages or salary deducted.
- C. Full time firemen to do misc. work, painting, washing of walls, cleaning of equipment after emergency runs and fire runs, maintenance on trucks. (*)
- D. Volunteer calls after hours are to be paid same as other volunteer firemen.

- C. DUTIES As prescribed by Officer in charge or work sheets and schedules as available. Work duties and schedules shall continue throughout weekends and holidays as well as week days. Fulltime personnel are expected to participate in department activities of extra-curricular nature including all training programs offered by department.
- F. VACATIONS: Vacations, outlined as follows will be granted after one full year of service from date of employment. Daytime Personnel: 14 calendar days per year. Legal holidays during days off shall be compensated by equal work day time off. All vacations periods and compensated time off must be approved by chief officer in charge. 56 hour per week shift personnel: 5 consecutive 25 hour work shifts, 2 additional 24 hour work shifts will be allowed in each calendar year as compensation time for holidays. Compensation time must be taken other than Saturday or Sunday and must be taken within the calendar year earned. Any trades of shift or work time by personnel must be approved by the chief officer in charge.

3. July 4th

5. Thanksgiving Day
6. Christman Day

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Clerk is to be notified of all vacation time by the department heads or deviation there from prior to such deviation. Clerk is to notify trustees of schedules, etc.

- G. UNIFORMS: As furnished by the Department. Personnel will provide and wear black dress type, lace shoes, black, dark blue or white socks and black belt. The uniforms as outlined and provided shall be worn while on duty.
- H. Men must present a neat appearance to public at all times.
- I. SICK LEAVE: 1. Employees collect 15.6 sick days per year. This may accumulate to 90 days over six year period. A 24 hour of duty is considered 3 sick days time for "56 hour" men. All sick leaves of more than two sick days duration must have a doctor's written certification.
2. An employee may be allowed leave with pay for more than five (5) days per year for illness in his immediate family. Such leave shall be charged against the accumulated sick leave of any such employee. Illness in the immediate family shall be defined as illness of wife, son, daughter, mother or father, or any other relative living in the house of the employee.
3. An employee may be allowed leave with pay for not to exceed three work days for death of any relative or of any person living in the home of employee. Such leave shall be charged against the accumulated sick leave of any such employee.
4. When an employee is absent for any reason a certified report for such absence, signed by his superior (Fire Chief or Trustee) shall be completed by the employee on a form supplied by the clerk and shall be filed with the clerk in not less than 15 days following the last day of such absence.
- 4.a. When an employee is absent for more than three days as a result of personal illness, a doctor's statement on a form to be supplied by clerk or chief in addition to the above certified record shall be filed with the clerk, in not less than 15 days following the last day of such absence.
- 4.b. An employee shall not be required to swear to such certified record but the signing and filing of such record by any employee shall be certification by him that the facts and statement contained in said report are true and correct, and the filing of any willfully false statement by an employee shall be considered as grounds for such disciplinary action as the Trustees may deem advisable.
- Fire Chief is to supply a quarterly report of all absence on April 1, July 1, October 1, and January 1.
- J. PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS OF PERSONNEL: It is the obligation of each person hired as a member, and therefore a representative of the Sharon Township Fire Department, to maintain his personal moral character and public image on a responsible and honorable scale. A Fireman's personal private life is his own as long as it does not adversely reflect on his association with this department in any way. Should this become an item of concern or objection by the department, it will be considered neglect of duty and responsibility.

The above regulations are in addition to the General Rules & Regulations of the department as provided. Changes, additions, deletions may be made as required and deemed necessary by the chief officer in charge.

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Fire Chief recommended that Fireman Cave, Lewis and Hall be increased to the next step as of January 1, 1971. Mr. Loomis moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that these Firemen be promoted to the next step. All voted "Aye" thereon.

Mr. Nichols moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that the Salary Scale, effective January 1, 1971, for full time firemen be accepted as submitted. All voted "Aye" thereon. Schedule is placed on file.

Sharon Township War Memorial

Its Ups and Downs



The impressive building at 137 East Granville Road, although built in the mid-1800's, was dedicated as the Sharon Township Memorial only twenty-three and one-third years ago, according to The Worthington News of November 6 and 13, 1947. Nor was its existence uncomplicated either before or after the dedication. Money problems dogged the heels of its Board of Trustees continuously even postponing for four months the proposed July 4, 1947, dedication ceremonies.

In a front page editorial November 1, 1945, the editor of The News, the late Leonard Insley, apparently voiced the desire of the community for a "living War Memorial" . . . "to commemorate the services of all members and veterans of the armed forces."

This time veterans were to have a worthwhile memorial-one which they and the community could use. "All the World War I boys got was a pile of dirt in Walnut Grove Cemetery where they faithfully go every Decoration Day to remember their buddies who lie buried there," the editor

representatives from the U. S. Army, the U. S. Navy and the American Legion. Although the remodeling was still not completed, the building was in condition to be used . . . "first, for the use of all veterans of Sharon Township and, secondly, for the use of all worthy organizations of the Township." Some 800 to 1,000 persons monthly were reported to be using the building without charge, according to a statement in the Sept. 18, 1952, issue of The News.

However, "the best laid plans . . ." The initial five year levy expired, and three successive attempts (1950, 1951 and 1952) to have an operating-maintenance tax levy passed by the voters met with failure. Time and again (or so it seems from reading back issues of The News) an announced date for closing the War Memorial Building to the public was scratched. The building remained open.

For instance, prior to the Feb. 1, 1952, date for closing, a committee was formed to raise money to keep the building open. Chairman was Fred Palmer, mem-

blasted. In agreement with this sentiment, the voters in Sharon Township at the Nov. 6 (1945) election voted for a special tax levy of 1 mill, which was to run for five years. The levy passed by 69% (699 votes for, 311 against).

Thereupon, the Sharon Township Trustees appointed a Memorial Board, consisting of eleven trustees, of which seven must be "honorably discharged veterans of one or more wars." Said Board, charged with determining the location, design, etc., for the Memorial, included: civilians—Lester Miller, Carl Knost, George T. Harding and Mrs. Crawford F. Pope; veterans — Warren E. Inasley, Col. Robert Harsh, I. M. McCampbell, Charles D. Wing, Bernard Lawless, Forrest R. Detrick and Richard Morgan. Detrick was elected president; Inasley, vice-president and Wing, secretary-treasurer. The trustees would serve without compensation.

While waiting for the monies from the special tax levy to become available, the eleven man board busied itself looking into possible sites, questioning local organizations to learn how interested their members might be in using the proposed building, etc. And—in early December of 1945 the Sharon Township Democratic Club gave \$25—the first contribution — to the Memorial fund.

A year later, December 20, 1946, the Sharon Township Memorial Board of Trustees purchased "the beautiful and stately Lynn Wright home at 137 East Granville Road." It had housed three generations of Wrights, having been built by Horace W. Wright. The well-treed lot had a frontage of 145 ft. and a depth of 332 ft.

The Board's decision to buy and remodel the building rather than build came as a result of the high cost of labor and building materials. The eight room Wright home offered ample space and could be used in the nearer future.

In May of '47, it was announced that the Sharon War Memorial would be dedicated on July 4th, but July Fourth came and went—with no dedication.

Because of rising costs, labor conditions and shortages, the remodeling was incomplete (too incomplete to warrant dedication ceremonies) and, according to the report in the October 16, 1947, issue of The News, a sum of seven to eight thousand dollars in excess of the levy was needed. Wilson Posey was named to find ways to get more money.

A \$225 gift came from the Worthington Women's Club in May earmarked for use in furnishing a women's room or other equipment. A committee of five from the club was chosen to supervise. That July the Village Offices were moved to the Memorial building's second floor from the Jones building.

Finally—on Armistice Day, November 11, 1947 — a dedication service and open house were held. Speakers included repre-

bers, Mrs. Warren E. Inasley and Dr. L. C. Scatterday. Contributions came in from 36 organizations and also individuals to tide (Please turn to page 4)

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

What's a Township To Do?

Litterbugs are making it expensive and tough to cut weeds in Sharon Township.

What used to be a one-man, one-day job now takes up to four members of the road crew more than a week to do said Gene Moore, assistant superintendent.

TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE Carl Knost said crewmen have found everything from auto engine blocks to old hot water tanks along road berms. Those and smaller bits of litter have put the tractor's cutter bar out of commission.

A replacement would cost \$1,500, both men said. But replacing the bar is uneconomical because it requires purchasing a conversion kit if one exists. The broken bar is mechanically powered, while most produced now are hydraulically powered.

The cutter bar's teeth have been broken, the blade bent, and bearings now rattle, said Moore, because of roadside rubbish.

BEFORE THE TOWNSHIP equipment broke, a man in a pickup truck followed the tractor with spare parts.

Now an extra man or two are sent out ahead of a rented tractor to remove things from the path. "We have to pay a man \$3 an hour for that," Moore commented. Daily rent for the tractor and cutter is \$40.

Trustee John Loomis said that besides the 24 miles of berm, the crew is responsible for eight acres in Flint Cemetery and vacant lots often neglected by owners. The charge for mowing the lots is added to the tax duplicate.

KNOST SAID THE township's biggest eyesore is at the end of Westview Ave. off N. High St.. "We've buried three cars there in less than a year," he said. The area requires cleaning at least once a week, he added.

Last week the spot was littered with broken chunks of cement, a discarded grass seeder, numerous beer cans and a mutilated sign which once warned of the \$500 fine for dumping.

The answer for the problem is uncertain. Loomis said his main interest is getting the job done, which means continuing to rent the equipment. Loomis figures the \$200 annual rent is cheaper than replacing broken equipment.

Townships, Villages Pass Budget Deadline

Two Franklin County townships and three villages failed to file their 1972 budgets with the Franklin County auditor by Tuesday as required by state law, Chief Deputy Auditor Arthur Marland said Wednesday.

The townships are Brown and Sharon. The villages are Darbydale, Harrisburg and Valleyview.

FAILURE to file the budget on time means the town-

ships and municipalities may not receive any local government funds from the state's sales and intangibles taxes unless the Franklin County Budget Commission votes to waive the deadline restriction.

For 1971, Brown Township received \$9,000; Sharon Township \$11,900; Darbydale, \$7,700; Harrisburg, \$2,000; and Valleyview, \$10,000.

Three school districts—Columbus, Plain Local, and Scioto-Darby—also failed to submit 1972 budgets by the deadline, Marland said. He added, however, there is no penalty for school districts that fail to comply with the filing deadline.

PLAIN LOCAL and Scioto-Darby school districts filed their budgets Wednesday morning, Marland said.

The Columbus Board of Education passed its 1972 budget at a meeting Tuesday evening.



JOSEPHINUM SEEKS PROTECTION

Columbus Cancels Fire Co

Msgr. Gilbert Schmenk of the seminary said the City of Columbus has decided not to renew the contract for first call fire protection it had with Sharon Township for the area of Columbus in which the Josephinum is located.

THE CONTRACT has been

in effect since the Josephinum and neighboring areas became part of Columbus. Before annexation, the area was covered by the township fire department, which has a station at 805 High St. in Worthington.

Now the institution is under the protection of the Columbus Fire Division, and

the closest fire house is at 5750 Maple Canyon Dr., north of Rt. 161.

Because of the possible loss of Sharon Township fire protection, according to Schmenk, the college will probably face increased fire insurance rates. He said the college's distance from the

The Pontifical College Josephinum, 7625 N. High St., may have to become a private fire company to maintain the protection the Sharon Township Fire Department has been providing the institution.

Other factors, such as the construction material of a building and its safety features, also enter into the rating, Rutter said.

The Josephinum presently pays "some \$3,000 per year" for fire insurance, Schmenk said. He said the institution now housing approximately

275 people has suffered \$3,000 in fire damage in the last 40 years.

WHEN SCHMENK questioned the township trustees about the possibility of a private protection contract between the Josephinum and the township, he was told the question would have to be researched with the Franklin County prosecutor's office.

Tommy L. Thompson of the prosecutor's office told The Dispatch the township has no authority to enter into a contract with a private corporation, but can contract with a private fire company, Thompson said the Josephinum might buy a piece of fire equipment, become a private fire company, and thereby become an eligible contract partner.
