Retired Caretaker Enjoys Life Despite His Reduction of Activity

At 66, Merlin Denig says he's "gettin' on."

His eyes aren't as sharp as they were when he hunted turtles in the swamps near Worthington, and the arthritis in his hands doesn't ease

enough these days to let him do much carving or fashioning of woodland scenes, handiwork that has attracted public attention in his community for many years.

BUT HE HAS the little

house he built for himself on Rosslyn Ave. in Sharon Township, a "mean old dog" to keep him company and shelves full of mementos from 50 years as a cemetery caretaker.

The arthritis forced him to retire as caretaker for Walnut Grove and Flint cemeteries last April, taking with him an American Legion citation and large collections of woodcarvings and Indian artifacts.

A widower, he has daughters in Worthington, Westerville and Delaware, all married. They visit "now and then," and sometimes he goes out to shop or just to walk.

BUT MOSTLY he's content to "sit around and just do nothin' much," watching television or reminiscing with callers.

He can remember where he found old stone cooking pots, arrowheads and polished Petoskey stones, all uncovered while digging graves at Walnut Grove. Some of his arrowheads aren't much larger than fingertips. Others look big enough to kill the largest buck — or the fiercest brave.

On a writing table Denig keeps a clay cast of a turtle he once caught "in a pond out by the old tile factory at the east end of Lincoln Ave. One of the clay men there at the factory made it for me."

TURTLE HUNTING and turtle fishing were his favorite pastimes, and he tells proudly of catching 275 pounds of turtles in a week.

"I remember one time we went out," he says, "And I had this old line I was mad at. It snapped six times and I said I'd just get rid of it. Pretty soon I felt like I had something real big on there.

"My brother said: 'Yeah, you've got a big log, is what you got.' But I kept haulin' in and I had two big old soft-shell turtles, one hooked through the head, the other one through the foot. That was the most I ever caught at once."

WAS IT A GOOD career, 50 years taking care of gravesites, collecting Indian lore, carving, hunting turtles?

"I reckon," says Merlin Denig. "I had some good times. But 50 years is long enough in one place for any man."



One of the objectives of the Worthington Historical Society is to encourage preservation of landmarks which help to establish and illustrate the historic record of the community.

With this point in mind, we have asked the Sharon Township Trustees to consider very seriously what steps could be taken to preserve the Town Hall at the corner of Hartford and E. Granville Rd. We feel this building should be saved as a part of Worthington's historic heritage.

The best natural defense against indiscriminate redevelopment is beneficial use of old buildings. Such efforts are being made throughout the nation. In many towns the business community and groups active in historic preservation are working hand in hand — not to change cities into museums—but to keep alive the aesthetic value and historic charm of an area. In the new ecology of survival, many persons are taking a closer look at historic preservation and what it can do to improve the quality of American life.

A succinct remark by Buffalo Tiger, Chief of the Miccosukee Indians, in Miami, Florida, sums it up very well. He was speaking of the Everglades, but his words could be applied to any area. He said, "You can't make it. You can't buy it. And when it's gone, it's gone forever."

A Landmark — Will It Be Preserved?

The building, shown above, known as the Sharon Township Hall, is not owned entirely by the Township, but it is owned jointly by the Township and International Order of Odd Fellows. It is located at 67 East Granville Road.

The land on which this building now stands was originally owned by the Episcopal Church. In 1856 the district school board purchased the site and built this structure as a two-room school building with a second floor for other than school use.

In 1870 the school board sold the building to Sharon Township for the sum of \$2500. In 1937 while James Kilbourne School was under construction, and again in 1944, Sharon Township loaned the lower floor to the school board for the use of the sixth grade. There was a time when this building was the only voting place for Worthington and Sharon Township.

In 1856 the I.O.O.F. Lodge took a five-year lease on the second floor. In 1873 the lodge purchased the second floor and half of the lot. Free use of the lower hall and stairway was included in the contract. The lodge and township agreed to share equally in the upkeep of the building

and the lot.

The I.O.O.F. Lodge was granted a charter on April 16, 1855, and in 1880 a charter was granted to the Daughters of Rebekah and both have used this building for their meeting place since that time.

Now the building is in need of a new roof, and the building itself needs painting, along with various other repairs.

The Township Trustees contacted the local I.O.O.F. and the trustees were told to contact the Grand Lodge in Springfield. A letter was sent to the Grand Lodge I.O.O.F. in Springfield on November 26, 1969, asking the Grand Lodge to pay half the repair on the building or to sell their half of the building to the township. The trustees asked that the letter be answered by February 1, 1970. To date, no answer has come from the Grand Lodge or local lodge.

The News also learned that the grass is mowed by the Trustees and that the Trustees take care of snow removal in the winter, furnish toilet facilities, paper and towels for this building.

What is the future of this building? The News would like to see the building preserved if at all possible.



To Retire at End of School Year



George V. Wing

George V. Wing, 111 Chaucer Ct., a member of the staff of the Columbus Public Schools since 1938, today announced his retirement effective at the end of the current school year.

Although a teacher in the system at West for 12 years and a visiting teacher for 18 years, Wing is perhaps best known throughout the entire school system as "the congenial photographer."

Back in 1950 he casually made it known that he might be available to take pictures when needed and the system "gave him a try." For the next 18 years, he was tried. He was excused from time to time to capture important events on film, he was temporarily transferred to handle special assignments, and he worked evenings and weekends pushing the shutter button for the schools.

As the demands for pictures became more pressing and the school system grew, he was named the official school photographer in 1968 and assigned to the department of publications and public affairs.

Wing estimates that, since he first started taking pictures for the schools, he has clicked the shutter at least 20,000 times ... fact is, he's worn out seven cameras in the process and has been in every school in the system dozens of times through the years.

He's quite a civic minded gentleman, too. He served for 10 years as mayor of the Village of Worthington and is currently in his 6th year as a trustee of Sharon Township. He served on the ration board during World War II and was the county director of Civilian Defense for a period fol-

lowing the War. In a total of 13 tries for public office, he was successful in ten.

Now that he's decided to retire, Mr. Wing is busy making plans for the future. He's purchased a mobile home and plans to travel extensively with his wife, Betty. He also intends to keep his camera operating—but for pleasure. He'll concentrate his efforts on travel pictures rather than classroom scenes.





Carl O. Knost

Carl Knost, 80 W. Wilson Bridge Road, has been appointed Sharon Township trustee. He will replace George V. Wing, who has resigned in order to enjoy his official retirement from the Columbus School System. The Knost appointment is effective July 1st.

Mr. Knost had previously served as Sharon Township trustee. Appointed in 1962 to fill the vacancy created by the death of one of the trustees, he served until after the election last November when his name was withheld from the ballot because of a technicality. His write-in campaign failed with his name being written in incorrectly under headings, such as council, board of education, municipal judge, etc.

Mr. Knost has been a resident of Sharon Township for 50 years. He was road and bridge inspector with the State Highway Department for one year and with the Franklin County Engineers for thirteen years. He owned and operated his own blacktop and paving business the past twenty-three years but has now retired. His son, Bill Hamilton, is continuing the business.

A Wrong Righted

Many who know the circumstances surrounding Carl Knost's failure to win in last November's elections feel a wrong has now been righted. Knost, then an incumbent candidate for Sharon Township trustee, was prevented from getting his name on the official ballot because his petitions--with valid signatures -- were not all stamped by the same notary's seal. This type of technicality was later -- but too late for Carl Knost -- declared to be insufficient reason for keeping a person's name off the ballot.

Because of the puzzling procedure involved in "writing-in" a candidate on the voting machines, Knost found himself receiving votes for councilman, school board member, municipal judge, etc., and he lost his bid to continue as Sharon Township trustee.

The Sharon Township trustees have now corrected that wrong. They have appointed Knost to fill the vacancy created by the resignation this month of George Wing.





Sharon Township Board Seeks Decision on Hall

In a step toward deciding the fate of Sharon Township Hall, the township trustees Wednesday night named an appraiser who will help determine the value of the building at Hartford St. and Granville Rd.

The trustees, who share ownership of the hall with the Odd Fellows, appointed Ohio State Bank official Norman W. Lehman as their ap-

praiser. The Odd Fellows have named Allen B. Shaw of Worthington Realty as their representative.

LEHMAN AND Shaw are to choose a third appraiser. The three will make a decision on the hall's value so the owners can decide whether its worth justifies making needed improvements for continued use as a township hall.

Trustee chairman John Loomis said officials of St. John's Episcopal Church, nearest property owner to the west, are interested in buying the hall.

In another matter, the trustees voiced concern about the way the Franklin County Auditor's office has been distributing tax money.

The trustees said the money formerly was distributed in two or three payments a year. Of late, they said, funds have arrived in an irregular series of partial payments, usually only after inquiries by the township clerk, Mrs. Eleanor Bierly.

In other action, two property owners from Westview Ave. asked the trustees what plans they had for drainage improvement on the street.

WESTVIEW AVE. extends west about one mile from High St. to the Olentangy River. Some sections of it have no drainage facilities.

Trustee Carl Knost told E. H. Forney and John M. Bartok that he would find out the township's legal rights and report in a week.

Mrs. Insley, Worthington News, stated that she was not in favor of selling the Township Hall but using the building as a community building.





Will This Landmark Be Preserved?



The building known as the Township Hall, if it could speak, would have much to tell the City of Worthington. Built in 1856 by the district school board, it was used as a school until 1870 when Sharon Township became the owner for the sum of \$2500.

In 1873 the I.O.O.F. lodge purchased the second floor and half of the lot with free use of the lower hall and stairway and agreed to share equally in the upkeep of the building and lot.

The building was used later by the Worthington School System while additional classrooms were being constructed. It is used as a voting precinct during election time, by the Worthington Garden Clubs for their annual plant sale and also as a classroom for a dancing school. It has also been used for Sunday School.

The addition to the back of the building at one time was used to house the only piece of fire equipment owned by Sharon Township.

The News would like to know if there are others in the community who feel as we do that the building should be preserved. It has been suggested as a Youth Center but we at this time have not been convinced that the Youth of the Community want a Youth Center. Do the youth want a youth center or is it the adults who want a youth center?

If you are interested in seeing the building preserved as one of our landmarks and have a suggestion on the future use of the building, please write the Worthington News, Box 30, Worthington, Ohio 43085. Only letters which are hand signed will be used in determining the thoughts of the community.

Won't you let us know today if you are interested in the preservation of the building?

The Sharon Memorial Building was saved from destruction a few years ago when interested individuals and groups subscribed funds to keep it open. Can we do it again?

Fate of Township Hall Discussed At Joint Meeting

A joint meeting of the Sharon Township Trustees and the I.O.O.F. was held Wednesday, September 2, to discuss the future of the Township Hall at 67 E. Granville Road.

The township building is owned jointly by Sharon Township and the I.O.O.F. The upper floor and half of the lot are owned by I.O.O.F. with free use of the lower hall and stairway. The lower floor and half of the lot are owned by the Township. In a contract entered into in 1873, the lodge and township agreed to share equally in the upkeep of the building.

According to the trustees, the lodge has not shared in the upkeep of the grounds in either summer or winter and the building is in need of much repair.

John Loomis, chairman of the trustees, presided at the joint meeting and asked what the two bodies wanted to do about the building. He indicated he was in favor of selling the structure. Mr. Loomis stated that the township trustees had been offered rooms in the Sharon Memorial Building.

A spokesman for the lodge asked why the trustees didn't sell their share but did not indicate that the lodge wanted to buy it.

The two groups agreed to have the building appraised with the trustees appointing one appraiser, the lodge one appraiser and then the two appraisers appointing a third. It was agreed that the cost of the appraisers would be shared equally by both groups.

Griff Weld, an interested citizen of the community, and two representatives of the Teen Council at the High School were present. Mr. Weld said he was interested in the building being preserved and expressed his hope that the building might be used for a Youth Center.

Mrs. Warren E. Insley, of the Worthington News, said she was opposed to the sale of the building by the trustees and would like to have it preserved.

Three Appraisers Appointed For Township Hall

Three appraisers have been appointed to determine the value of the Sharon Township Hall owned jointly by Sharon Township and the I.O.O.F. The property, located at the corner of Hartford Street and E. Granville Road, is in need of repair and, according to an agreement entered into in 1873, the lodge and township agreed to share equally in the upkeep of the building.

The township owns the lower floor and half of the lot while the upper floor and half of the lot are owned by the I.O.O.F. who also have free use of the lower hall and stairway.

Township officials do not feel that they should, or can according to law, repair the building at township expense and the I.O.O.F. does not offer to help in the renovation, according to the trustees.

The only alternative, according to John Loomis, chairman of the trustees, is to sell the building. Mr. Loomis stated at the trustee meeting, October 7, that officials of St. John's Episcopal Church, who own land adjacent to the township hall, were interested in purchasing the property.

At a joint meeting of the two bodies on September 2 it was agreed that the building would be appraised with the trustees appointing one appraiser, the lodge one appraiser and then the two appraisers appointing a third. It was agreed that the cost of the appraisers would be shared equally by both groups.

Norman W. Lehman has been appointed as appraiser by the I.O.O.F. and Allen B. Shaw as appraiser for the trustees. Charles Balderson was appointed by Mr. Lehman and Mr. Shaw as the third appraiser.

The appraisal was expected to be made Wednesday, yesterday.

Sharon Township Board Seeks Decision on Hall

In a step toward deciding the fate of Sharon Township Hall, the township trustees Wednesday night named an appraiser who will help determine the value of the building at Hartford St. and Granville Rd.

The trustees, who share ownership of the hall with the Odd Fellows, appointed Ohio State Bank official Norman W. Lehman as their ap-

praiser. The Odd Fellows have named Allen B. Shaw of Worthington Realty as their representative.

LEHMAN AND Shaw are to choose a third appraiser. The three will make a decision on the hall's value so the owners can decide whether its worth justifies making needed improvements for continued use as a township hall.

Trustee chairman John Loomis said officials of St. John's Episcopal Church, nearest property owner to the west, are interested in buying the hall.

In another matter, the trustees voiced concern about the way the Franklin County Auditor's office has been distributing tax money.

The trustees said the money formerly was distributed in two or three payments a year. Of late, they said, funds have arrived in an irregular series of partial payments, usually only after inquiries by the township clerk, Mrs. Eleanor Bierly.

In other action, two property owners from Westview Ave. asked the trustees what plans they had for drainage improvement on the street.

WESTVIEW AVE. extends west about one mile from High St. to the Olentangy River. Some sections of it have no drainage facilities.

Trustee Carl Knost told E. H. Forney and John M. Bartok that he would find out the township's legal rights and report in a week.

Free Junker Removal Offered by Sheriff

Junk cars in Franklin County will be removed at no cost to either citizens or the county.

The sheriff's office Thursday signed a one-year contract with Mid-States Mobile Auto Crushers of Dallas, Tex.

MID-STATES will establish a holding yard at 1698 Williams Rd. and will guarantee that 10 days after the junkers are picked up, they will be removed from the county and crushed into scrap metal.

According to sheriff's Capt. Earl Smith, when deputies are notified of a junk car, the car will be tagged. A picture will be taken of the car and held for three years to guard the county against charges of picking up operating vehicles.

SMITH SAID persons hav-

ing junk cars on private property in the unincorporated areas of the county should notify the sheriff's office to have the vehicles picked up.

Smith estimated there are about 3,000 abandoned junk cars in the county's unincorporated sections.

Auditor Unable to Understand Tax Money Disbursement Critic

The Franklin County Auditor's office professed to be baffled Thursday by a township's criticism of its tax settlement distribution procedures.

Sharon Township trustees and the township clerk complained during a meeting Wednesday night that the tax distribution, which in past years had been made regularly in amounts as high as \$90,000, lately has been dribbling through irregularly, in lesser amounts.

MRS. ELEANOR Bierly, Sharon Township clerk, said the payments from the auditor usually have not arrived until after she requested them.

Mrs. Bierly said she had contacted the auditor's office asking about the fund advances "at least three times" since Aug. 31.

The clerk said she would visit the office Thursday to

request a \$30,000 advance on the money owed the township. "We don't know exactly how much we're due," Mrs. Bierly told the meeting.

SHARON Township's annual budget is about \$200,000.

Auditor Arch Warren Thursday quickly referred a reporter's questions regarding the township complaint to his deputy, Arthur W. Marland.

Marland said he could not understand Sharon Township's raising the issue.

"**SHE (MRS. Bierly)** has received an advancement against the year-end tax settlement every time she's come in for it. I don't know

what she's hollering about," Marland said.

Marland explained that his office makes four settlements yearly, two from real property and two from personal property taxes.

The deputy auditor said his records show Sharon Township received these advances this year:

MARCH 21 — \$25,000;
May 1 — \$30,000; **July 23** — \$25,000; and **Aug. 31** — \$30,000.

Marland said the figures represent no change in the auditor's distribution of advances.

HE SAID he has received no complaints from any other township or school district in the county regarding the fund advances.

"They all love me. They all think I'm the greatest guy in the world because I hand out to sour almost from the day the money," Marland asserted.



The present Blue Cross & Blue Shield has exceptionally good coverage but only covers 39% of total exposure of medical bills. The Time Insurance Company offers a 61% total coverage on the 80/20 basis.



Odd Partnership

ONE OF the least noticed of Worthington's many historic structures is this white-painted brick building at Granville Road and Hartford Street. It goes under two names and has two owners. The curious 100-year partnership is between Sharon Township Trustees and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows Lodge. The building itself is much older than the partnership. Spartan in its simplicity, it was built in 1856 before architectural frills became a must, and constructed to house Worthington schools, the first such to have more than a single room.

The first logs felled by the founders of Worthington were laid up into a community building—church, school, town hall and whatnot—in 1803. It was on the present site of the library and served school purposes five years. Later it was razed to clear the site for a private educational institution, Worthington Academy. School was held in several locations afterward, and finally in a one-room brick building on Oxford Street. In 1855 the town bought the rear end of St. John's Episcopal Church lot and built this structure, apparently for less than \$2,000. The first floor was divided into two schoolrooms, each with rough wooden desks and a recitation bench up front. The upper floor was used for public purposes.

In 1855 an Odd Fellows Lodge was formed in the

village. Six years later it had grown so that it was necessary to lease the upper floor for \$50 a year. In 1871 the school was moved into the "old Medical College building" on the library site. The move came about because a lawyer, James E. Wright, uncovered the fact that the college had long ago usurped the "school lot" set aside when the village was founded. He had it returned to the schools and classes were moved. It is told that older pupils used to terrify their younger colleagues by conducting them to the med school's old basement "pickling vat" and describing its horrible contents. In the meantime, the school board sold the other building to its two present owners.

The Odd Fellows have a long history. It is claimed the organization was given its name in 79 A.D. by Titus Caesar. In the 1600s several unions existed in Europe under the name "Odd Fellows Craftsmen." America's Odd Fellows Lodge is directly descended from the 700,000 member "Manchester Unity" founded in England in 1812. The first IOOF Lodge in America was organized in 1819.

Now there is a move afoot for the partners to dispose of the property, which has been appraised at \$40,000. St. John's Church is said to be interested in acquiring it.
