

Mr. Nichols moved, seconded by Mr. Loomis that the following bills be approved for payment.





Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission letter regarding Application 73-5 requesting rezoning of lands westside of driveway connecting Rosslyn and Kanawha Avenue just east of the Olangangy River from Rural to four family Townshouse was received. Trustees agree with the Commission on their disapproval of said application request. Reason: The site is located in the flood plain. 2. The apartments would not be served by central sewer facilities 3. The alley is not sufficiently improved to accommodate the additional development.

Mr. & Mrs. Roach of the Famous French Galleries, appeared before the board to discuss the possibility of renting or buying the township hall should they have to move from the Memorial building because of the zoning there. Trustees have had several groups interested in the township hall. (St. Johns church, a Reality Company, WFRD Radio Station, & Crandal antiques.

The decals are placed on the outside windows of tots' rooms and on the bottom of their bedroom doors as shown above by (left to right) Tom Conway of Heritage, Sharon Township Fire Chief "Bud" Sanford and Dublin Fire Chief Gary Termear. The decals allow firemen to immediately spot the rooms where children are likely to be and to check those rooms first during fire and emergencies.

state (first in the county) to purchase a heart-lung resuscitator; a mechanical means of closed heart treatment. This was prior to the advent of the "heartmobile."

Since the first of the year we have had men trained in and practicing the teachings of the first two courses (circulatory monitoring and intravenous therapy and instruction) used in the diagnosis and treatment of heart attacks and accident shocks. The final step of purchasing a defibrillator and EKG machine was authorized by the trustees in April of this year. This was after watching three generations of machines being developed and then discarded as obsolete.

In the meantime we have made use of our mutual aid agreements and on each heart attack run we call either Dublin, or Columbus and they arrive by the time we have the patient ready for their equipment.

Dublin has only been able to get three men trained since they received their equipment. Classes are small (12 trainees) and attendance is controlled by the Columbus Fire Department. Sharon Township has two men completing the course this week, three to start this week and three to start in December. This will make it possible to give round-the-clock service when the two heart machines arrive.

When the Lions Club offered to sponsor the purchase of these \$6,000.00 machines, as a community project, we were delighted. This permitted us to move up the replacement date of our small emergency vehicle from 1974 to 1973. This new \$15,500.00 vehicle will have all of the latest improvements, plus added facilities for the new heart equipment.

As can be seen from the above, treatment of heart attacks is not a new experience to our excellent fire squad men. The addition of the new equipment will extend their ability to monitor and treat heart patients.

In answer to your reference to the operating levy, we are pleased to report that a new \$55,000.00 pumper has been ordered (delivery in June 1974), four fulltime firemen have been added to the roster at a cost of \$48,000 per year, and a portion of the Firemen's Pension increase has been paid. These were the needs for which we requested the added income.

The whole Paramedic movement is in a state of flux. Daily new innovations are introduced making today's equipment and training procedures obsolete tomorrow. A collection of lectures given this spring by professional medical people interested in the program is available at the township fire house. Anyone interested in the development history and the multitude of problems involved is welcome to peruse its contents at their leisure.

Trust this clears up some of the misinformation,

Letter to the Editor:

To Residents of Worthington, Riverlea and Sharon Township:

I hesitate to answer a letter signed by an anonymous person because these persons rarely know of what they speak or take from context and revise it to suit their needs.

However, to "Name Withheld by Request" in the "Worthington News" of October 18, 1973, I feel certain facts should be made known:

1. Only two communities outside the City of Columbus are operating Medic Units at this time. Two other communities have the equipment, but are not trained in its use. Instruction and training facilities are listed. Only twelve para-medics are assigned to each class which is held at the Ohio State University. Only two or three squadmen from each department, outside of Columbus, are assigned to each class. Progress in this field has been so rapid that instructors and classroom facilities have not kept pace.

2. The Sharon Township Board of Trustees approved the purchase of mobile coronary care equipment on April 18, 1973. This precision equipment cannot be purchased from some discount house. It must be carefully checked out and evaluated and this cannot be accomplished over night. In the mean time this department was approached by the Worthington Lions Club expressing their desire to make a community project of purchasing and donating mobile coronary care equipment to the fire department. The Sharon Township Board of Trustees agreed to this and since this was to save money from the fire department budget, the Trustee Board agreed to purchase a new squad vehicle one year ahead of the projected replacement. The training of a paramedic is a progression of steps, (1) Circulatory Monitoring - (2) Intravenous Therapy and Instruction - (3) Intubation Instruction - (4) and last, the instructions in the proper use of the defibrillator and EKG machines. This instruction teaches not only how to use the machines, but when to use them and then make the proper diagnosis and treatment from same.

I am sure the people of this community would rather have well trained men answering their calls for assistance than to have the equipment and not know how to use it. This department has always strived to keep the squadmen and firemen up to date on all phases of training, and this we have been able to do thanks to the taxpayers and the foresight of the Sharon Township Board of Trustees.

Worthington eyes leaving township

Worthington city officials are considering the procedure and desirability of withdrawing from Sharon Township.

Mike Minister, director of administration, said Friday, he is preparing a memorandum for City Manager George Shapter outlining what would be involved in such a move.

THE OBJECT OF such a withdrawal, another city official told the Citizen-Journal, is to exempt Worthington residents from the 3.5 mill Sharon Township property tax.

Currently Worthington residents pay \$54.90 on each \$1000 property value valuation.

MINISTER explained Council will have to make final judgment on the matter and said he expected it to be discussed at the Jan. 14 meeting.

Asked to assess the prevailing mood of Council on the issue, Minister replied Council has indicated "it needs more information" on the issue and will give "extremely thorough consideration" on the matter before making a decision.

MINISTER SAID he is looking closely at "what will happen to the 3.5 mill township property tax if Worthington withdraws from the township.

Sharon Township provides fire protection for the city.

If Worthington withdrew from the township it would have to find some means of fire protection and its resi-

dents would not have to pay a 3.5 mill township property tax.

IF THE CITY decided to build its own fire department, Minister said he thought the city would have to levy a tax to finance it.

Minister said he is still studying the question of whether city residents would pay more or less taxes if the city withdrew from the township.

MINISTER POINTED out Sharon Township receives a "healthy chunk" of federal revenue sharing funds but said "if we pull out we do not automatically get that money."

If council decides to withdraw from the township, Minister said the County Commissioners must approve.

Worthington Township would then be created and coincide geographically with the city of Worthington.
