- A. Paid men when on duty at the fire house are under the supervision of the Fire Chief, or next ranking officer in the Chiefs absence.
- B. Classification will be Firemen: Under Firemen's Relief & Pension Fund (6%)
- C. Full Time firemen to do misc. work, paint, wash walls, clean after emergency runs and fire runs, maintenance on trucks.
- D. Volunteer calls after hours are to be paid same as other volunteer firemen.
- E. Hours Scheduled.

- F. Vacation: Two weeks vacation after one year of service, not accumulative; with the following legal holidays off
 1. New Years Day
 2. Memorial Day
 3. July 4th
 4. Labor Day
 5. Thanksgiving Day
 6. Christmas Day

- 7. $\frac{1}{2}$ Day prior to Christmas
- $\frac{1}{2}$ Day prior to New Years

(This time off applies to all township employees)

- G. Work Clothes to be alike for all firemen.
- H. Men must present a neat appearance to public at all times.
- I. Absence and Sick Leave.
 - A. Each employee shall be allowed .03 days sick leave at full pay for each completed week of service, the maximum accumulation for a year being 15.6 dyas. At no time shall the accumulation exceed 90 days.
 - B. An employee may be allowed leave with pay for not more than five days per year for illness in his immediate family. Such leave shall be charged against the accumulated sick leave of any such employee. Illness in the immediate family shall be defined as illness of wife, son, daughter, mother or father, or any other relative living in the house of the employee.

Held "Special" January 1, 1967 2:00 P.M. 19

- C. An employee may be allowed leave with pay for not to exceed three work days for death of any relative or of any person living in the home of employee. Such leave shall be charged against the accumulated sick leave of any such employee.
- D. When an employee is absent for any reason, a certified report for such absence, signed by his superior (Fire Chief or Trustee) shall be completed by the employee on a form supplied by the clerk and shall be filed with the clerk in not less than 15 days (fifteen) following the last day of such absence.
 - 1. When an employee is absent for more than three days as a result of personal illness, a doctor's statement on a form to be supplied by the clerk in addition to the above certified record shall be filed with the clerk, in not less than 15 days following the last day of such absence.
 - 2. An employee shall not be required to swear to such certified record but the signing and filing of such record by any employee shall be certification by him that the facts and statements contained in said report are true and correct, and the filing of any willfully false statement by an employee shall be considered as grounds for such disciplinary action as the Trustees may deem advisable.

Membership on the Walnut Grove Cemetery Association was discussed. Mr. Loo is moved, seconded by Mr. Knost that George V. Wing be re-appointed to serve on this board. A member will be appointed from the City of Council and one appointed who lives within the City of Worthington.

Unfinished business was discussed: Painting and sandblasting of the township hall, purchasing file cabinets for the clerks office, all were tabled.

Mrs. Glenna Taylor, Worthington News reporter visitor.

Road Supt. reported on all work on roads. Reported that the street sign had been erected at Plum Tree and Mulberry; black-top filled in hole in pavement thru out the township; that cinders and salt had been removed; that Pocomo Road had been check for ice control; Worthington Towers parking lot checked; requested a new tire for the tractor; that he had checked with Goodrick and the \$89.00 dollar tire could be purchased for \$55.00 about. Mr. Knost moved, seconded by Mr. Wing that the self contained, air regerating air mack packs refilling apparatus be purchased and paid from the left over funds from the heart pump drive sponsored by the J.C.C. and balance be paid by the volunteer firemen's fund as mentioned. All voted "Aye" thereon

Fire Chief submitted literature regarding the purchase of a duplicator. The Photoradip Electra, Photorapid ElectraMatic and Photorapid One-Shep machines were discussed. Trustees felt that the need was not great enough at this time.

Mr. James A. Rumbaugh, 8395 Cleveland Avenue, Sharon Township, Westerville, Ohio appeared before the board to file an Animal Claim for one Dorset Sheep valued at \$25.00 killed 12-10-66. Newly Purchased Air Pump Will Aid Firemen



Pictured inspecting the newest piece of equipment at the Sharon Township Fire Department are two local Jaycees, Jim Randall (center) and Gordon Clark (right). Assistant Fire Chief Phil Thomas is explaining the new air pump, which is used to regenerate the tanks for the breathing masks worn by firemen as they enter a burning building. The Worthington Jaycees contributed the bulk of the funds necessary for the purchase of this machine. The balance was paid by the local firemen's association.

Two local Jaycees stopped in at the Sharon Fire Department recently and learned much about the piece of equipment which helped to buy, the expensive air-pump for regenerating individual air tanks needed by the firemen when they enter burning buildings.

Assistant Fire Chief Phil Thomas pointed out that, in this age of plastics and other man-made materials, there is seldom such a thing as a simple wood fire. The man-made materials, when burning, give off noxious fumes which can be of great danger to the firemen.

With this new piece of equipment, all six of the personal masks can be kept charged with enough air to last each fireman about 30 minutes. In case of a severe emergency, these tanks could be recharged immediately at the local fire station. Until this pump was delivered, the individual tanks had to be sent away for recharging and were away from the building (completely out of use) for as much as two or three days.

This sophisticated pump, for compressing and purifying air to be stored in tanks and breathed by firemen, cost \$1476., according to Fire Chief Bud Sanford. The Jaycees had a balance of more than \$1100 from their "Save-a-Life" campaign, which provided the funds for the heart-lung resuscitator now being carried on every squad call to a home. This balance was applied to the purchase price of the big pressure pump and the amount needed to finish the purchase was contributed by the firemen in the amount of about \$300 from their own association's funds.

It is an appropriate conclusion for the Jaycees "Save-a-Life" campaign to use the balance of the fund to benefit the safety of the local firemen as they go

about their work in the protection of life and property. gt

Sharon Fire Department Is Outstanding

Questions about the Sharon Township Fire Department have been collecting in my head ever since the train wreck of December, 1965. Some of the questions are: What kind of a plan did they have that could be adapted to that situation to take care of everything so smoothly? How did the other squads learn about the wreck so soon and arrive in the spot 17-strong in less than twenty minutes? How were the passengers moved out so quickly? Then, after the appreciation dinner given by the railroad, more questions arose: Do we have something special here in Worthington? If so, what is it?

For those of us who take the skilled service of a rescue squad (which is well equipped) for granted, it is a shock to learn from Chief L. F. (Bud) Sanford that Richland County (of which Mansfield is the county seat) does not have a single squad and there are only two in all of Logan County (where Bellefontaine is located).

The requirements for serving on the Worthington-based fire department are strict. There are six full-time, paid men in the local department and 23 volunteers. The reserves are men in training, who will take nine months to a year to complete the course. Training in the state is standardized by the use of one manual. Many illustrations in this manual were posed by Sharon Township squadmen. In addition, the local department is one of the few to have its own manual, which illustrates and describes all of its equipment and how it works.

Much additional training is required to become a squadman. A teacher's license is required to teach fire and squad work in Ohio. Chief Sanford is a qualified teacher. He is also vice president of the international rescue organization, which would like to see a Federal law passed, requiring anyone driving an emergency vehicle to have first aid and rescue training. Chief Sanford is also president of the recently formed Ohio State First Aid and Rescue Association. In addition, he is a speaker-in-demand at various other county associations to explain the tremendous program here in Central Ohio.

While the Armed Forces have simulated attacks, the fire and rescue units of Franklin County have simulated disasters.

In Franklin County, excluding Columbus, there are 22 fire departments in 31 stations with 32 squads. The Franklin County Firefighters Association has a little pocket-size book which lists the equipment available at each station. Need a complete disaster bus? Hamilton Township has one, which is equipped with medical supplies, radio control center, public address systems and kitchen facilities. Skin-divers are available by calling another number.

Altogether, the Franklin County (excluding Columbus) firemen number 777, of which there are 151 full-time paid personnel.

They serve a total population of 253,227. There are 63 pumpers in the county with a pumping capacity of 47,500 gallons per minute.

The communication system is set up so that Sharon's home station can use its own frequency exclusively or, by a flip of a switch, can cut in on the county-wide fire communications system. There is a code number that declares to all of the other departments that the station on the air has a severe emergency. All other departments relinquish the use of that frequency until the unit with the problem declares it under control.

This is what happened here in December, 1965, when the train wrecked at the Outerbelt. Chief Sanford got the call and went to the site to assess the situation. The other stations were alerted. In less than 20 minutes, 17 rescue squads were at the scene. They didn't wait to be called, they came on in to help. As it happened, they weren't needed. Considering the type of accident and the many cars off the track, it could have been so much worse.

Chief Sanford explained the three zones that are set up in case of a disaster. The Red Zone is the area of the immediate emergency, only the rescue squads go into it. The White Zone is where the doctors and nurses would be called to diagnose or treat. The Blue Zone is the gathering point for transportation. This is the general set up; it is much more complicated and very well planned.

During a simulated disaster, the Franklin County squads work closely with the hospitals and doctors and nurses. All of the groups are constantly updating their programs.

Many times as we meet with various people or groups of people, the question of the public's right to know comes up. Most of the time anyone connected with any news media (worth his salt) will say that the public has a right to know everything, instantly. In talking with this professional man who is so well versed on his work, Chief Sanford has convinced me that there should be a twenty minute hold put on the news in times of disaster so that the emergency vehicles can get in and out of the area before the roads get clogged with spectators.

Another question came up while we were visiting: Should people who are handicapped and who live alone or stay alone all day, be registered with the Fire Department? Chief Sanford said he would be glad to have such information, if the people want to volunteer that information.

One question led to another as we got better acquainted with this public service organization.

What makes Sharon Township Fire Department one of the finest in the State of Ohio? There is skill, training, manpower, equipment, planning and a leader, who is devoted to the whole program. Last and not least there is good communication between the department and the Sharon Township Trustees, under whom they work.

Facts from Sharon Township Fire Dept.

Interesting statistics furnished recently by the Sharon Township Fire Department show that emergency squad runs outnumber fire runs by more than 3 to 1 during the past year. During 1966, the squad runs totaled 453 and the fire runs numbered 141.

The most frequent cause of fire is the auto, bringing 31 calls during the preceding year. Following closely on the auto as a principal cause of fire is the electrical fire which added up to 28. Grass fires, trash fires and carelessness accounted for 16, 13, and 12 runs, respectively. Seven calls came to assist other departments; five were caused by defective heating and five more were caused by overheating. Children playing with matches caused four fires and food burning caused three, smoking two, and five had undetermined causes. There were two possible arson cases last year.

The most frequent calls occurred in July with 79. The busiest hours are between noon and six in the evening. In fact, in a year's time, the calls in the p.m. outnumber the calls in the a.m. 404 to 190. The fewest calls are made between 2:00 and 6:00 in the morning, but in a year's time even they total 28 calls in the wee hours. February was the quietest month last year, the only month with less than 40 calls tabulated. During that month 28 calls were answered.

WHEREAS, the Township Trustees of Sharon Township, Ohio, Franklin County, Ohio in accordance with the provisions of their Resolution dated May 13, 1967, authority was granted by that body to enter into a contract with the City of Columbus to provide full coverage fire protection service, including inhalator service to portions of said City hereinafter described; now, therefore,

For the consideration hereinafter named, the Township Trustees of Sharon Township, Ohio, hereby agree that the Fire Department of said Sharon Township will answer fire calls from that portion of the City of Columbus hereinafter described and its inhabitants and send fire apparatus and firemen thereto for the purpose of extinguishing fires in said portion of the City of Columbus in like manner as fire calls are answered and fires extinguished in Sharon Township, the said portion of the City of Columbus being also to receive the services of the inhalator squad of the Sharon Township Fire Department under this agreement. The officers of the Sharon Township Fire Department shall be in charge of and have full authority for fighting fires to which they respond in accordance with the provisions of this contract unless and until duly relieved of said authority by an officer or member of a responding unit or units of the City of Columbus Division of Fire. In the event that emergency has been removed prior to the arrival of Columbus units, the officer in charge of the Sharon Township Unit will promptly inform the Columbus Division of Fire.

The geographical area which is to be covered by the terms of this contract is annexation to the City of Columbus known as 219 and is described in full in Ordinance No. 1618-65 of the City of Columbus. A Copy of said Ordinance is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

In consideration for which the said City of Columbus agrees to pay to the Township Trustees of Sharon Township, Ohio, for said services the sum of Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-two Dollars (\$20,752.00) per year for the duration of this contract. This amount to be paid in advance in equal quarterly installments.

It is further mutually agreed and understood that in no case shall the Township Trustees of Sharon Township be liable in damages to said City of Columbus, or any of its inhabitants, for failure to answer any fire call, or for lack of speed in answering any such call, or for any inadequacy in equipment, negligent operation


