The following were present: Trustees, Warren E. Insley, John D. Loomis, Melvin L. Thomas; Clerk, Eleanor McMannus, Road Superintendent, Merlin T. Denig; Fire Chief, L. C. Brown; Constables, Orban J. Barker and Norman Severance.

The first meeting of 1956 was called to order by the clerk of Sharon Township.

The clerk asked for nominations for the Chairman and for Vice-Chairman.

Mr. Thomas nominated Mr. Loomis as chairman and Mr. Insley as vice-chairman and moved that the nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast a unanimous ballot for each nominee.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Insley and carried. All voted "aye" thereon.

The Trustees set the first and third Wednesday of each month at 8:00 P.M. as the meeting night and time.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the compensation of Merlin Denig, Road Superintendent be set at \$50.00 per week for the fiscal year 1956 for time spent in the performance of his duties, and that Mr. Denig's bond be set at \$200.00. All trustees voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the Road Superintendent be authorized to employ such assistants as he may deem necessary and that the same be compensated at a rate set by said superintendent not to exceed \$1.75 per hour for a foreman and \$1.50 per hour for other help. Motion carried. All voted "Aye."

Mr. Thomas moved, seconded by Mr. Insley that Merlin Denig be designated Superintendent of Flint Cemetery. All voted "Aye." thereon.

Merlin Denig submitted an Inventory List of the Tools and Machinery and equipment owned by Sharon Township.

Mr. Insley introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Trustees of Sharon Township, Franklin County, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Orban J. Barker and Norman Severance be designated as Police Constables of Sharon Township.

SECTION 2. That the compensation of Constable Severance be set at \$3.50 per call answered in performance of his duties as a Police Constable; and the the compensation of Constable Parker be set \$3,600.00 per year for the performance of his duties as a Police Constable, provided, however, that said Constable Parker shall provide a police cruiser at his own expense and shall spend at least eight (8) hours per day in patrolling roads, keeping the peace, and protecting property.

Constables reports were submitted, discussed and filed.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the compensation of Harold A. Morgan, Fire House Custodian be set at \$200.00 per month; ~~with~~ two weeks vacation with pay, custodian to obtain reliable person to take charge during vacation time. All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the compensation of L. C. Brown, Sharon Township Fire Chief be set at \$100.00 per month for the fiscal year of 1956 for time spent in the performance of his duties. Motion carried. All voted "aye" thereon.

Fire Chief Brown submitted the Fire and Emergency Squad reports which were discussed and filed. Three applications for reserve firemen were submitted. Arthur E. Loose, 876 Oxford Street, Donald Everhart, 110 West Lincoln Avenue, and Jerry Cunningham, 105 West Lincoln Avenue. Mr. J. W. Ashton has been appointed as a regular fireman.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that the three men be appointed as reserve firemen upon the request and the recommendation of the Fire Chief. All voted "aye" thereon.

Fire Chief Brown requested some new electric equipment for the Dodge Fire Truck. (Leece La Alternator.) Request was granted.

Fire Chief Brown reported that the moisture on the north wall of the Fire Engine House and apartment was damaging the interior of the building. He was asked to contact the architect.

The Clerk was instructed to complete and return the application, submitted by Fire Chief Brown, to the Federal Communication Commission which renews the communication license from February 1, 1956 to February 1, 1957.

Assistant Fire Chief, Richard Bratton and Bud Sanford reported on a local radio fire call system. (Motoral) They stated that 3/4 of the cost would be paid by the Civil Defense. They were asked to verify this and to report to the trustees when statement was received.

Mr. A. J. Walker, 356 Lincoln Avenue, requested that the Trustees take legal action to prosecute the City of Columbus for the Industrial Rezoning and for damaging property owners of Sharon Township. The matter was discussed and it is the opinion of the trustees that there is no legal recourse at this time.

Mr. Insley introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION





The minutes of the January 17, 1956 meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Denig reported due to the shortage of cinders the Township Road Superintendent has been forced to use salt for ice control on all township roads and highways.

Since the spreading equipment now available is inadequate for the salt it is desirable to purchase a spreader suitable for salt and sand use.

Mr. Insley moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that a Tarco Scotchman Chemical Spreader be purchased. All voted "aye" thereon. The price of the Scotchman Chemical Spreader is \$565.00

The Fire Chief has recommended Frank Simmons as a Reserve Fireman. Mr. Insley, moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that Frank Simmons be appointed as a reserve fireman upon the recommendation of the Fire Chief. All voted "aye" thereon.

The Trustees have authorized the Assistant Fire chief to have four blankets dry cleaned.

Dana Aleshire submitted his letter of resignation from the Sharon Township Fire Department to be effective February 1, 1956.

Assistant Fire Chief, Richard Bratton spoke to the trustees regarding the purchase of a Fold-a-way Stretcher #18 and handles for the present stretcher. Trustees do not wish to purchase the stretcher at this time but will consider approval at a later date.

Mr. Insley, moved, seconded by Mr. Thomas that Form #3011, Resolution Accepting the Amounts and Rates as determined by the Budget Commission and Authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor be accepted. Motion carried. All vote "aye" thereon.

The annexation to Columbus of a 241-acre tract of Sharon Township between Graceland Shopping Center and Worthington was approved Tuesday in a split decision by the County Commissioners.

An hour and a half debate on the question was won by Harrison W. Smith, jr., attorney for the annexation petitioners. Opposing the move was Attorney John Palcich and Sharon Township Trustee Warren Insley.

At the conclusion of the hearing, Commissioners Henry A. Koontz and C. P. Lauderbaugh voted for the annexation, while Commissioner Harry T. Vigor was opposed.

OPPOSITION TO THE annexation centered around the Homedale School, 50 Westview Ave. The school is not included in the area annexed. However, opponents said the school would be left an "island which would ultimately fall to Columbus."

The area annexed is bounded on the south by Graceland Shopping Center, on the west by the Olentangy River, on the north by Worthington and on the east by a line east of High St. The tract is of horseshoe shape and excludes W. Kanawa Ave., Rosslyn Ave. and Westview Ave.

Smith told the commissioners that 80 of 108 resident property owners of the area signed the petitions.

THE VILLAGE OF Gahanna was made 363 acres larger Tuesday when commissioners approved the annexation of tracts in Mifflin and Jefferson Townships.



Says Township Finances Depend on Fund Formulas

The financial plight of Ohio's 1335 townships hinges upon radical changes in the formula for distribution of the local government fund back in the counties.

This contention was driven home by spokesmen for the townships in an all-day session before the local government committee of the Ohio Legislative Service Commission, Wednesday.

Judge Charles P. Baker, Jr., former member of the lower house and currently secretary of the Ohio State Association of Township Trustees and Clerks, cited numerous factors which contribute to the financial difficulties confronting the townships.

He asserted that the sales tax law itself assumes that this tax belongs to the state and not to local governments and, he urged that restoration be made of the original earmarking for local governments of the 40 per cent of sales tax revenues.

THE PRESENT formula for distribution—based upon need and using the two factors of 25 per cent upon population and 75 per cent of the municipal tax duplicate—places a penalty upon the thrifty policies of townships, he said. The new formula, providing for a more equitable distribution whereby both the municipalities and the counties would lose \$1 million each, and the townships would benefit to

distribution, 20 per cent would go to the counties and 30 per cent divided between the cities and townships. This distribution would be based 50 per cent upon population, and 50 per cent upon the entire tax duplicate, rather than the municipal duplicate.

The second half of the distribution would be divided among all subdivisions in accordance with the ratio determined by multiplying the tax duplicate by the mandated levies within the 10-mill tax limitation.

This latter feature would retain recognition of the provision set up when the electorate adopted the 10-mill real property limitation. At that time, the Legislature provided that the subdivisions should receive from the county budget commissions a millage equal to two-thirds of the average millage during the five years prior to the reduction of the 15-mill limitation by constitutional amendment.

CONTENDING THAT in most counties, the "needs" basis is "ignored," Judge Baker said:

"The needs basis tends to reward the extravagant and penalize the thrifty. One of

large cities for the collection Baker pointed out that residents of the townships contribute to this concentrated collection, and said:

"Townships and counties should be given some credit of collection of the sales tax in the cities, because the sales tax is a per capita tax, and we should go to the ultimate source and not just the intermediate source."

JOHN D. LOOMIS, trustee of Sharon Township, Franklin County, told the committee that last year the townships received a total of \$16,000 out of \$2,500,000 allocated to the entire county.

"The distribution, based upon needs, has been resolved down to the fact that if the trustee is not a good salesman, the township is at a disadvantage before the budget commission."

Myron Berlin, Trustee of County, recommended that a trustee be placed on the county budget commission, to give the trustees a voice.

The meeting was the last of a series held by the committee, seeking to devise a more equitable formula for the distribution of the local government fund. Previous hearings were held for the municipalities and the counties.

Trustees, Clerks Join With Mayors In Utility Fight

The Franklin County Association of Township Trustees and Clerks unanimously joined hands with the recently formed Franklin County Mayors Council last Thursday night in an attempt to obtain sewer and water facilities on a fair and equitable basis.

Mayor Blosser of Upper Arlington addressed the county association meeting held at New Albany and emphasized that no municipality had been able to secure a satisfactory sewage contract from Columbus.

Allen Pretzman, attorney for the Scioto-Sandusky Conservancy District, outlined procedures whereby the townships and municipalities outside of Columbus (or any number of them who choose to go together) could unite to provide their own water supply and sewage disposal facilities.

The trustees adopted a strongly worded resolution citing that non-residents pay 33 per cent of the total general fund income collected annually in Columbus but have no control over expenditures; that the present Columbus administration has arbitrarily refused to join a metropolitan sewer and water district but has used its control of the water shed as an "annexation Club"; and that no government subdivision surrounding the City of Columbus has been able to negotiate a reasonable contract for water and sewer service with the present city administration.

In addition to joining forces with the Mayor's Council, the county trustee-clerk association voted to sponsor legislation in the next session of the Ohio Legislature to force any municipality which has monopolized available water supplies to distribute the same under a metropolitan authority.

Sharon Township Trustee John D. Loomis is president of the county association. All three Sharon Township trustees were present at the county meeting and voted in favor of the resolution.





That the Township trustees adopt a general plan for the improvement of the Fire Department premises including the construction of a parking lot to the rear of the Engine House and the future addition of another stall to the north of the present building; That said plan include a new driveway to be located along the south side of the Township property and to be separated from the drive entrance of the property of the Village of Worthington; That a new concrete entrance be constructed from High Street to the Township east lot lines, that the plan include the removal of and relocation to the rear of the lot of the trees on the south part of the township property; that the residents of the immediate neighborhood be informed of said plan within a reasonable time; that proper drainage be checked for said parking area and that an inquiry be made regarding the storm sewer drain. Since a joint meeting had been called by the Village of Worthington Official with the Township Official, Presbyterian Church Officials and the Park Federal Savings & Loan Officials for June 28, 1956 relative to a joint improvement plan for the area, and since said meeting hadn't materialized and no effort had been made toward another joint meeting the Trustees deemed it advisable to proceed independently with checking prices, etc for improvement and maintenance of same. That the first step in the plan to improve the Fire department parking area be to employ the Slemmons Gardens to remove and replace the Red Maple tree to the rear of the property; That Fire Chief Brown be authorized to contract for the construction of the side drive and drive entrance and to secure the necessary permits, that an estimated cost of construction to be less than \$1,000.00.

All voted "aye" thereon.

Mr. Thomas moved, seconded by Mr. Insley that the following bills be approved for payment.


